## MEMBERS

Term, four years; Salary, \$20,000 per annum; President receives additional \$150 for each day served during Regular or extraordinary session or interim committee meetings, and \$150 for attending to legislative business during the interim. The Majority and Minority Leaders receive additional \$50 per diem compensation during sessions. The chairs of the committees on Finance and Judiciary and up to six additional persons to be named by the President shall each receive, for up to a maximum of thirty days, an additional \$150 per day for attending to legislative business in their offices in the capitol building when the Legislature is not in regular, extended or extraordinary session and interim committees are not meeting. Mileage and any other provisions for expenses are governed by Article 2A, Chapter 4 of the Code of West Virginia.

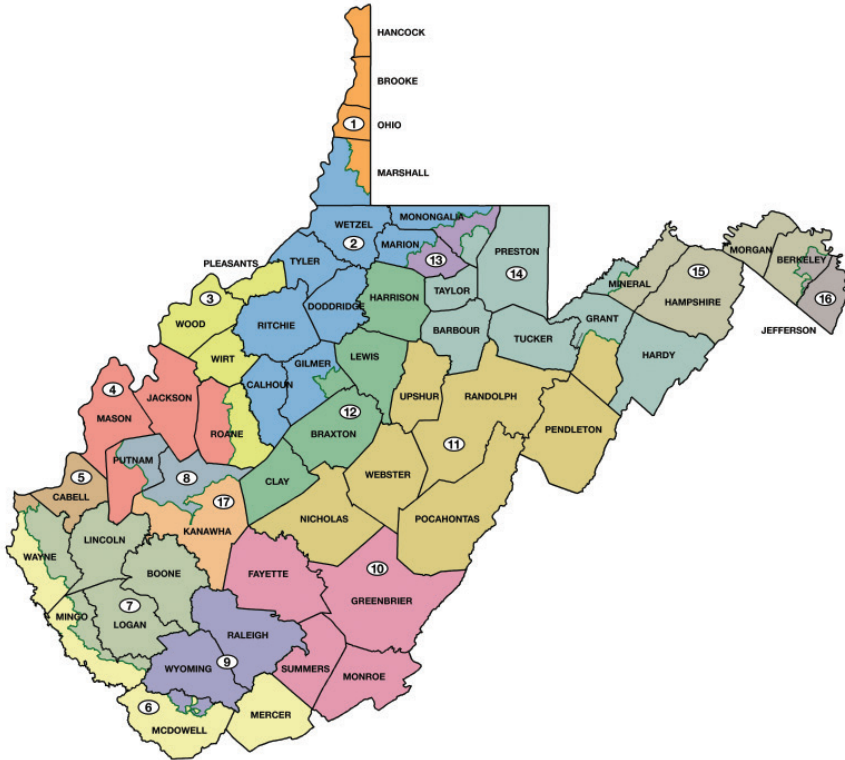

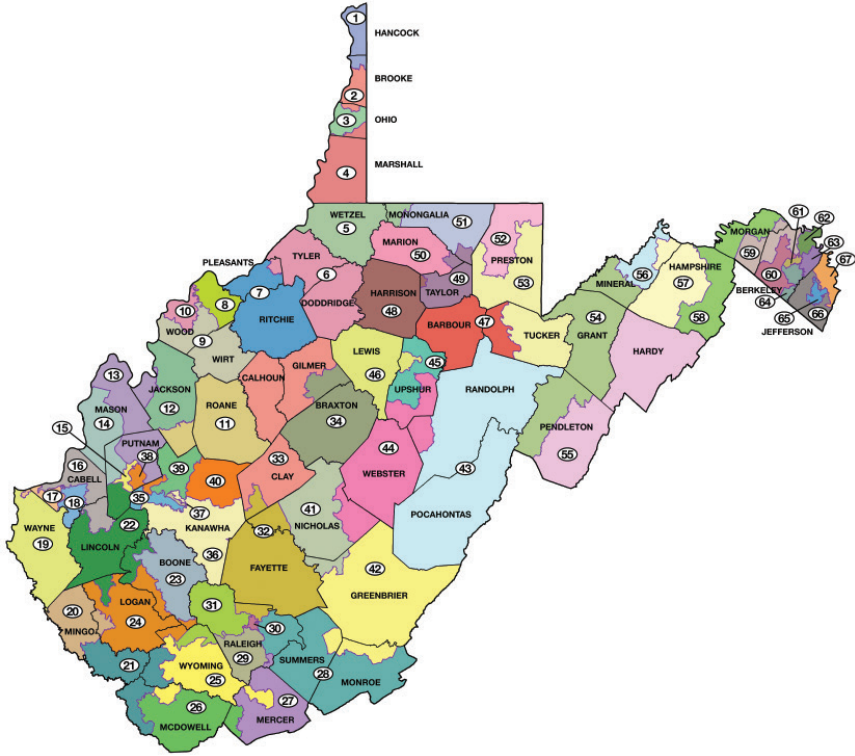

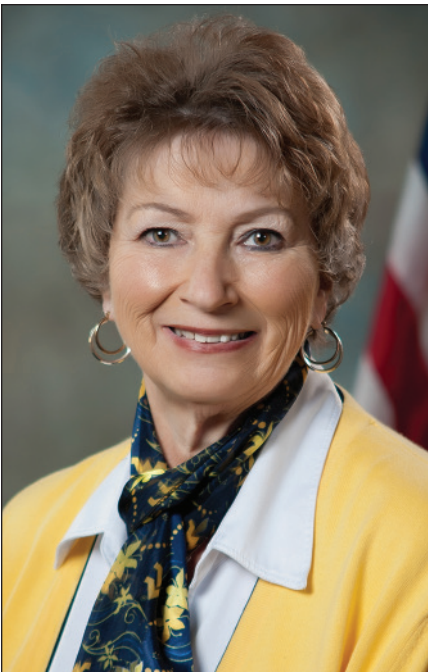

## LEGISLATIVE RULE-MAKING REVIEW COMMITTEE

Members receive the same compensation and expenses received by other members of the Legislature serving on committees. ## COURT OF CLAIMS

*Building 1, Room W-334, 1900 Kanawha Boulevard, East*

Created by an Act of the Legislature in 1967. Consists of three judges appointed by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Delegates, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate. Each appointment is made from a list of three qualified nominees furnished by the Board of Governors of the West Virginia State Bar. Bipartisan; term, six years; Per Diem, \$160 for each day actually served, not to exceed one hundred days in any fiscal year (excluding Crime Victims Compensation Fund time), plus expenses based upon legislative reimbursement.

The Court of Claims hears claims against the state for money damages. Awards made are subject to final approval by the Legislature. Upon request, it issues advisory opinions to state agencies. It also investigates and hears claims, made by victims of criminally injurious conduct, for awards from a crime victims compensation fund created by the Legislature in 1981 and funded by additional court costs being imposed upon every person pleading guilty or found guilty of a felony or misdemeanor other than a non-moving traffic offense. Originally created by House Concurrent Resolution No. 2 during the Second Extraordinary Session of the Legislature, September 1968, as the Purchasing Practices and Procedures Commission, and continued as a statutory body by Chapter 87, Acts, Regular Session, 1971; to consist of five members of the Senate to be appointed by the President and five members of the House of Delegates to be appointed by the Speaker; headed by cochairs, one for the Senate and one for the House, presently the President and Speaker; members shall receive travel, interim and out-of-state expenses and shall employ legal, technical, investigative, clerical, stenographic, advisory and other personnel to be appointed by the Joint Committee on Government and Finance; authority of the Commission expanded and name changed by enactment of Senate Bill No. 356, Regular Session, 1980, to include any investigations involving possible malfeasance or misfeasance of matters of the state. (*Code 4-5*)
