| 10 | A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by |
| 11 | adding thereto a new article, designated §30-7D-1, §30-7D-2 |
| 12 | and §30-7D-3, §30-7D-4, §30-7D-5, §30-7D-6, §30-7D-7, §30-7D- |
| 13 | 8, $$30-7D-9$, $$30-7D-10$, $$30-7D-11$, $$30-7D-12$, $$30-7D-13$ and |
| 14 | \$30-7D-14, all relating to medication assistive persons in the |
| 15 | nursing home setting including a pilot program, requirements |
| 16 | and criminal penalty. |
| 17 | Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia: |
| 18 | That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended |
| 19 | by adding thereto a new article, designated $$30-7D-1$, $$30-7D-2$, |
| 20 | \$30-7D-3, \$30-7D-4, \$30-7D-5, \$30-7D-6, \$30-7D-7, \$30-7D-8, \$30-7D- |
| 21 | 9, §30-7D-10, §30-7D-11, §30-7D-12, §30-7D-13 and §30-7D-14, all to |
| 22 | read as follows: |
| 23 | ARTICLE 7D. MEDICATION ASSISTIVE PERSONS. |
| 24 | §30-7D-1. Pilot program. |
| 25 | A pilot program is herein developed to monitor the practice of |

- 1 unlicensed personnel administering medication in the nursing home
- 2 setting. Monitoring of this pilot program shall be conducted by
- 3 the West Virginia Board of Examiners for Registered Professional
- 4 Nurses and shall encompass the following:
- 5 (1) Signed participation agreements from a minimum of ten
- 6 nursing homes licensed in West Virginia that meet participation
- 7 requirements as determined by the board. The pilot program will
- 8 not progress unless this requirement is met.
- 9 (2) After a period of six months of monitoring the
- 10 implementation of the pilot program, a report shall be provided to
- 11 the Legislative Commission for Health and Human Resources
- 12 Accountability.
- 13 **§30-7D-2**. **Definitions**.
- 14 As used in this article:
- 15 (1) "Board" means the West Virginia Board of Examiners for
- 16 Registered Professional Nurses;
- 17 (2) "Designated facility" means a type of facility determined
- 18 by the board as an environment in which medication assistive
- 19 persons may serve in accordance with the requirements of this
- 20 article and rules promulgated by the board;
- 21 (3) "Medication assistive person" means a person who is
- 22 certified by the board to administer certain nonprescription and
- 23 legend drugs in designated facilities;
- 24 (4) "Supervision" means the active oversight of patient care
- 25 services while on the premises of a designated facility in a manner
- 26 defined by the board; and

- 1 (5) "MA-C" is the designation for a person who is certified as
- 2 a medication assistive person.
- 3 §30-7D-3. Certificate required.
- 4 In order to safeguard life and health, any person serving or
- 5 offering to serve as a medication assistive person shall:
- 6 (1) Submit evidence that he or she is qualified; and
- 7 (2) Be certified as provided in this article.
- 8 §30-7D-4. Designated facilities.
- 9 (a) The West Virginia Board of Examiners for Registered
- 10 Professional Nurses shall designate the types of facilities that
- 11 may use medication assistive persons.
- 12 (b) (1) Designated facilities may not be required to use
- 13 medication assistive persons.
- 14 (2) If a designated facility elects to use medication
- 15 <u>assistive personnel</u>, the facility shall notify the board in a
- 16 manner prescribed by the board.
- 17 \$30-7D-5. Qualifications.
- 18 (a) In order to be certified as a medication assistive person,
- 19 an applicant shall submit to the West Virginia Board of Examiners
- 20 for Registered Professional Nurses an application and appropriate
- 21 fee. During the pilot program, temporary certificates will be
- 22 issued. At the completion of the pilot program, if proven
- 23 successful, qualified individuals holding a temporary certificate
- 24 as a medication assistive person meeting requirements for full
- 25 certification shall be issued a permanent certificate. The

- 1 application shall provide written evidence, verified by oath, that
- 2 the applicant:
- 3 (1)(A) Is currently listed in good standing on the state's
- 4 certified nurse aide registry;
- 5 (B) Has maintained registration on the state's certified nurse
- 6 aide registry continuously for a minimum of one year;
- 7 (C) Has completed at least one continuous year of full-time
- 8 experience as a certified nurse aide in this state;
- 9 (D) Is currently employed at a designated facility;
- 10 (E) Has a high school diploma or the equivalent;
- 11 (F) Has successfully completed a literacy and reading
- 12 comprehension screening process approved by the board;
- 13 (G) Has completed a state and federal criminal background
- 14 check in compliance with board requirements;
- 15 (H) Has successfully completed a medication assistive person
- 16 training course of not less than one hundred hours approved by the
- 17 board; and
- 18 (I) Has successfully passed an examination on subjects the
- 19 board determines; or
- 20 (2) (A) Has completed a portion of a nursing education program
- 21 equivalent to the medication assistive person training course; and
- 22 (B) Passed the medication aide examination.
- 23 (b) The board may issue a certification as a medication
- 24 <u>assistive person by endorsement to an applicant who has been</u>
- 25 licensed or certified as a medication assistive person under the
- 26 laws of another state or territory if:

- 1 (1) In the opinion of the board, the applicant meets the
- 2 qualifications of medication assistive persons in this state; and
- 3 (2) The board recommends certification.
- 4 (c) Any person holding a certification as a medication
- 5 assistive person may use the title "medication aide-certified" and
- 6 the abbreviation "MA-C".
- 7 **§30-7D-6.** Scope of work.
- 8 (a) (1) A medication assistive person may perform the delegated
- 9 nursing function of medication administration and related tasks in
- 10 accordance with rules promulgated by the West Virginia Board of
- 11 Examiners for Registered Professional Nurses.
- 12 (2) A medication assistive person shall perform medication
- 13 administration and related tasks only:
- 14 (A) At a designated facility; and
- 15 (B) Under the supervision of a registered professional nurse.
- 16 (3)(A) Medication administration is limited to the
- 17 administration of nonprescription and legend drugs ordered by an
- 18 authorized prescriber and only by the following methods:
- 19 (i) Orally;
- 20 (ii) Topically;
- 21 (iii) Drops for eye, ear or nose;
- 22 (iv) Vaginally;
- 23 (v) Rectally;
- 24 (vi) Transdermally; and
- 25 (vii) Via oral inhaler.
- 26 (B) Medication administration by a medication assistive person

- 1 may not include controlled substances.
- 2 (b) A medication assistive person may not:
- 3 (1) Receive, have access to or administer any controlled
- 4 substance;
- 5 (2) Administer parenteral, enteral, or injectable medications;
- 6 (3) Administer any substances by nasogastric, oralgastric or
- 7 gastrostomy tubes;
- 8 <u>(4) Calculate drug dosages;</u>
- 9 <u>(5) Destroy medication;</u>
- 10 (6) Receive orders either in writing or verbally for new or
- 11 changed medications;
- 12 (7) Transcribe orders from the medical record;
- 13 (8) Order initial medications;
- 14 (9) Evaluate medication error reports;
- 15 (10) Perform treatments;
- 16 (11) Conduct patient assessments or evaluations; or
- 17 (12) Engage in patient teaching activities.
- 18 §30-7D-7. Renewal of certifications.
- 19 (a)(1) The West Virginia Board of Examiners for Registered
- 20 Professional Nurses shall prescribe the procedure for the cyclical
- 21 renewal of medication assistive person certifications.
- 22 (2) In each case, the board shall provide a notification for
- 23 renewal to the medication assistive person at least thirty days
- 24 before the expiration date of the certification by United States
- 25 Postal Service or by electronic means.
- 26 (b)(1) Upon receipt of the renewal application and the fee,

- 1 the board shall verify the accuracy of the application.
- 2 (2) (A) If the board finds the application to be accurate and
- 3 related documents indicate that the applicant remains in good
- 4 standing, the board shall issue a certificate of renewal to the
- 5 applicant.
- 6 (B) As a condition of certification renewal, a medication
- 7 assistive person shall be:
- 8 (i) Currently listed in good standing on the state's certified
- 9 nurse aide registry; and
- 10 (ii) Required to satisfactorily complete all continuing
- 11 education required in the legislative rules governing the practice
- 12 of the MA-C.
- 13 (c) The renewal renders the holder of the certificate a legal
- 14 provider of medication assistive person services for the period
- 15 stated in the certificate of renewal.
- 16 (d) Any medication assistive person who allows his or her
- 17 certification to lapse by failing to renew the certification as
- 18 provided in this section may be reinstated by the board on:
- 19 (1) Payment of the renewal fee plus a penalty; and
- 20 (2) Submission of evidence that the person currently meets the
- 21 requirements to serve as a medication assistive person.
- 22 (e) Any person providing services as a medication assistive
- 23 person during the time his or her certification has lapsed is
- 24 considered to be providing services illegally and is subject to the
- 25 penalties provided for violations of this article.
- 26 §30-7D-8. Disciplinary actions.

- 1 (a) The West Virginia Board of Examiners for Registered
- 2 Professional Nurses has sole authority to deny, suspend, revoke or
- 3 limit any medication assistive person certificate issued by the
- 4 board or applied for in accordance with the provisions of this
- 5 article or to otherwise discipline a certificate holder upon proof
- 6 that the person:
- 7 (1) Is or was guilty of fraud or deceit in procuring or
- 8 attempting to procure a certificate to practice as a medication
- 9 aide certified;
- 10 (2) Has been found guilty of or pled guilty or nolo contendere
- 11 to a crime;
- 12 (3) Is unfit or incompetent by reason of negligence, habits or
- 13 other causes;
- 14 (4) Is habitually intemperate or is addicted to the use of
- 15 habit-forming drugs;
- 16 (5) Is mentally incompetent;
- 17 (6) Is guilty of unprofessional conduct;
- 18 <u>(7) Is practicing or attempting to practice as a medication</u>
- 19 aide certified without a certification;
- 20 (8) Has had a license, certificate, or registration revoked or
- 21 suspended;
- 22 (9) Has been placed on probation or under disciplinary order
- 23 in any jurisdiction;
- 24 (10) Has voluntarily surrendered a license, certification, or
- 25 registration and has not been reinstated in any jurisdiction; or
- 26 (11) Has willfully or repeatedly violated any of the

- 1 provisions of this article.
- 2 (b) The board shall refuse to issue or shall revoke the
- 3 certificate of any person who would be disqualified from employment
- 4 under the provisions of this law or the rules governing the
- 5 practice of the medication assistive person.
- 6 (c) Proceedings under this section shall be conducted in
- 7 accordance with the West Virginia Administrative Procedure Act,
- 8 chapter twenty-nine-a of this code.
- 9 **§30-7D-9**. **Penalty**.
- 10 (a) (1) It shall be a misdemeanor for any person to:
- 11 (A) Sell or fraudulently obtain or furnish any medication
- 12 <u>assistive person's certificate</u>, renewal or record, aid or abet in
- 13 any such sale or fraud;
- 14 (B) Serve as a medication assistive person under cover of any
- 15 certificate or record i<u>llegally or fraudulently obtained or signed</u>
- 16 or issued unlawfully or under fraudulent representation;
- 17 (C) Serve as a medication assistive person unless certified by
- 18 the West Virginia Board of Examiners for Registered Professional
- 19 Nurses;
- 20 (D) Use in connection with his or her name any of the
- 21 following titles, names, or initials if the user is not properly
- 22 certified under this article:
- 23 (i) Medication assistive person;
- 24 (ii) M.A.P.;
- 25 (iii) Medication aide;
- 26 (iv) Medication technician;

- 1 (v) Certified medication aide;
- 2 (vi) C.M.A.;
- 3 (vii) Medication Aide certified;
- 4 (viii) MA-C; or
- 5 (ix) Any other name, title, or initials that would cause a
- 6 reasonable person to believe the user is certified under this
- 7 article;
- 8 (E) Serve as a medication assistive person during the time his
- 9 or her certification is suspended;
- 10 (F) Conduct an education program for the preparation of
- 11 medication assistive persons unless the program has been approved
- 12 by the board; or
- 13 (G) Otherwise violate any provisions of this article.
- 14 **§30-7D-10**. Injunction.
- 15 (a) The Kanawha County circuit court is vested with
- 16 jurisdiction and power to enjoin the unlawful provision of
- 17 medication assistive person services in any county of the State of
- 18 West Virginia in a proceeding initiated by the West Virginia Board
- 19 of Examiners for Registered Professional Nurses, any member of the
- 20 board, or any citizen in this state.
- 21 (b) (1) The issuance of an injunction does not relieve a person
- 22 from criminal prosecution for violation of the provisions of this
- 23 <u>article.</u>
- 24 (2) The remedy of injunction is in addition to liability for
- 25 criminal prosecution.
- 26 §30-7D-11. Medication Assistive Person Advisory Committee.

- 1 (a) (1) The Medication Assistive Person Advisory Committee is
- 2 created as an advisory committee to the West Virginia Board of
- 3 Examiners for Registered Professional Nurses.
- 4 (2) The committee shall assist the board in implementing the
- 5 provisions of this article regarding medication assistive persons.
- 6 (b) The board shall appoint six members who have the
- 7 following qualifications:
- 8 (1) Two members shall be certified medication assistive
- 9 persons;
- 10 (2) One member shall be a licensed nursing home administrator
- 11 who has worked in that capacity for at least three years;
- 12 (3) One member shall be a registered nurse who has been in a
- 13 practice using certified nurse aides for at least three years;
- 14 (4) One member shall be a lay person representing the
- 15 interests of consumers of health care services; and
- 16 (5) One member shall be a nursing faculty member of a West
- 17 Virginia nursing education program.
- 18 <u>(c) Members shall serve three-year terms.</u>
- 19 (d) The board may remove any committee member after notice and
- 20 hearing for incapacity, incompetence, neglect of duty or
- 21 malfeasance in office.
- 22 (e) The members of the committee shall serve without
- 23 compensation but may receive expense reimbursement in accordance
- 24 with applicable law or rule.
- 25 §30-7D-12. Applicability of article.
- 26 Nothing in this article relieves a nurse from the

- 1 responsibility of assessing each patient daily and as needed to
- 2 assure public safety and safe medication administration.
- 3 §30-7D-13. Rulemaking authority.
- 4 The board may promulgate legislative rules pursuant to the
- 5 provisions of article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of the code.
