11	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$15-12-10$ of the Code of West Virginia,
12	1931, as amended, relating to requiring sex offenders to
13	verify their e-mail and other online identities in the same
14	way as they register their physical addresses.
15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That §15-12-10 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
17	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
18	ARTICLE 12. SEX OFFENDER REGISTRATION ACT.
19	§15-12-10. Address and online information verification.
20	All registrants, including those for whom there has been no
21	change in registration information since their initial registration
22	or previous address verification, must report, in the month of
23	their birth, or in the case of a sexually violent predator in the
24	months of January, April, July and October, to the State Police
25	detachment in their county or counties of registration and must

1 respond to all verification inquiries or and informational
2 requests, including but not limited to requests for online
3 information made by the State Police pursuant to this section. The
4 State Police shall verify addresses of those persons registered as
5 sexually violent predators every ninety days and all other
6 registered persons once a year. As used in this section, the term
7 "online information" shall mean all information required by
8 subdivision (8), subsection (d), section one-a, article twelve,
9 chapter fifteen of this code. The State Police may require
10 registrants to periodically submit to new fingerprints and
11 photographs as part of the verification process. The method of
12 verification shall be in accordance with internal management rules
13 pertaining thereto promulgated by the superintendent under
14 authority of section twenty-five, article two, chapter fifteen of
15 this code.
