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10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$15-2-31$ of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended; and to amend and reenact $\$15-2A-11$ of said
12	code, all relating to State Police, providing for payment of
13	medical costs of physical disability and/or mental disability
14	examinations approved by the Consolidated Public Retirement
15	Board under the State Police Death, Disability and Retirement
16	plan and the West Virginia State Police Retirement System;
17	providing for reinstatement to active duty under certain
18	conditions of formerly disabled State Police officers
19	considered no longer disabled from law enforcement work; and
20	providing that a former disability retirant reinstated to
21	active duty with the State Police shall rejoin the retirement
22	system in which originally enrolled with restoration of
23	credited service in force at the time of disability
24	retirement.
25	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
26	That §15-2-31 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,

- 1 be amended and reenacted; and that \$15-2A-11 of said code be
- 2 amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:
- 3 ARTICLE 2. WEST VIRGINIA STATE POLICE.
- 4 §15-2-31. Disability physical examinations; termination.
- (a) The board may require any retirant who has been retired 6 with compensation on account of disability to submit to a physical 7 and/or mental examination by a physician or physicians selected or 8 approved by the board and cause all costs incident to the 9 examination including hospital, laboratory, X-ray, medical and 10 physicians' fees to be paid out of funds appropriated to defray the 11 current expense of the agency and a report of the findings of the 12 physician or physicians shall be submitted in writing to the board All medical costs associated with the 13 for its consideration. 14 examination shall be paid by the fund. If, from the report or from 15 the report and hearing on the report, the board is of the opinion 16 and finds that the disabled retirant has recovered from the 17 disability to the extent that he or she is able to perform 18 adequately the duties of a law-enforcement officer, the board shall 19 order that all payments from the fund to that disabled retirant be the board shall within five working days provide 20 terminated 21 written notice of the finding to the Superintendent of State 22 Police, who shall reinstate the retirant to active duty as a member 23 of the department within forty-five days of the finding, unless the 24 retirant declines to be reinstated, is found by a background check 25 to be ineligible for reinstatement, or is found by the

1 Superintendent to be unacceptable due to the retirant's performance 2 evaluations during prior work with the department. 3 Superintendent shall promptly notify the Board when the retirant is 4 reinstated, is found ineligible for reinstatement due to a 5 background check or unacceptable prior performance evaluations, or 6 refuses reinstatement. The board shall order disability payments 7 from the fund to be terminated at the earlier of the date of the 8 retirant's reinstatement, regular retirement, failure of a 9 background check, finding of unacceptable prior performance 10 evaluation with the department, failure to accept reinstatement or 11 forty-five days from the board's finding. If, from the report or 12 the report and hearing on the report, the board is of the opinion 13 and finds that the disabled retirant has recovered from his or her 14 previously determined probable permanent disability to the extent 15 that he or she is able to engage in gainful employment but remains 16 unable to adequately perform the duties of a law-enforcement 17 officer, the board shall order the payment, in monthly installments 18 of an amount equal to two thirds of the salary, in the case of a 19 retirant retired under the provisions of section twenty-nine of 20 this article or equal to one half of the salary, in the case of a 21 retirant retired under the provisions of section thirty of this 22 article, excluding any compensation paid for overtime service, for 23 the twelve-month employment period immediately preceding the 24 disability award: Provided, That if the retirant had not been 25 employed with the fund for twelve months immediately prior to the 26 disability award, the amount of monthly salary shall be annualized

- 1 for the purpose of determining the benefit.
- 2 (b) A disability retirant who is returned to active duty as
- 3 <u>a member of the West Virginia State Police shall again become a</u>
- 4 member of the retirement system in which he or she was originally
- 5 enrolled and the retirant's credited service in force at the time
- 6 of retirement shall be restored.
- 7 ARTICLE 2A. WEST VIRGINIA STATE POLICE RETIREMENT SYSTEM.
- 8 \$15-2A-11. Same -- Physical examinations; termination.
- 9 (a) The board may require any disabled retirant to submit to 10 a physical or mental examination or both a physical and mental 11 examination by a physician or physicians selected or approved by 12 the board and cause all costs incident to the examination, 13 including hospital, laboratory, X-ray, medical and physicians' 14 fees, to be paid out of funds appropriated to defray the current 15 expenses of the agency, and the physician or physicians shall 16 submit a report of the findings of the physician or physicians in 17 writing to the board for its consideration. All medical costs 18 associated with the examination shall be paid by the fund. If from 19 the report, or from the report and hearing on the report, the board 20 is of the opinion and finds that the disabled retirant has 21 recovered from the disability to the extent that he or she is able 22 to perform adequately the duties of a law-enforcement officer, the 23 board shall order that all payments from the fund to that disabled 24 retirant be terminated the board shall within five working days 25 provide written notice of the finding to the Superintendent of

1 State Police, who shall reinstate the retirant to active duty as a 2 member of the department within forty-five days of the finding, 3 unless the retirant declines to be reinstated, is found by a 4 background check to be ineligible for reinstatement, or is found by 5 the Superintendent to be unacceptable due to the retirant's 6 performance evaluations during prior work with the department. The 7 Superintendent shall promptly notify the board when the retirant is 8 reinstated, is found ineligible for reinstatement due to a 9 background check or unacceptable prior performance evaluations, or 10 refuses reinstatement. The board shall order disability payments 11 from the fund to be terminated at the earlier of the date of the 12 retirant's reinstatement, regular retirement, failure of a 13 background check, finding of unacceptable prior performance 14 evaluation with the department, failure to accept reinstatement or 15 forty-five days from the board's finding. If from the report, or 16 the report and hearing on the report, the board is of the opinion 17 and finds that the disabled retirant has recovered from his or her 18 previously determined probable permanent disability to the extent 19 that he or she is able to engage in any gainful employment, but 20 unable to adequately perform the duties of a law-enforcement 21 officer, the board shall order, in the case of a disabled retirant 22 receiving benefits under the provisions of section nine of this 23 article, that the disabled retirant be paid annually from the fund 24 an amount equal to six tenths of the base salary paid to the 25 retirant in the last full twelve-month employment period. The board 26 shall order, in the case of a disabled retirant receiving benefits 2 disabled retirant be paid from the fund an amount equal to one 3 fourth of the base salary paid to the retirant in the last full 4 twelve-month employment period: *Provided*, That if the retirant had

- 12 of retirement shall be restored.
