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11	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by

15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended
17	by adding thereto a new article, designated $$16-43-1$$ and $$16-43-2$,
18	all to read as follows:
19	ARTICLE 43. BREAST FEEDING MOTHERS.
20	§16-43-1. Findings and purposes.
21	(a) The Legislature finds that:
22	(1) The encouragement of a public acceptance of breast feeding
23	is consistent with the promotion of family values between a mother
24	and her child and no mother should be made to feel incriminated or
25	socially ostracized for breast feeding her child.

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1 (2) Breast feeding a baby constitutes a basic act of nurturing 2 to which every mother and child has a right and which should be

3 encouraged in the interests of maternal and child health.

- 4 (3) Breast feeding provides significant health benefits to 5 both the mother and child.
- 6 (4) Social constraints of modern society weigh against the 7 choice of breast feeding and often result in new mothers opting to 8 choose formula feeding to avoid embarrassment, social ostracism, or 9 criminal prosecution.
- 10 (b) This part has the following purposes:
- 11 (1) To increase the incidence and duration of breast feeding 12 as a goal for optimal maternal and child health and nutrition;
- 13 (2) To enable women who so choose to freely breast feed their 14 children so that infants may be fed exclusively on breast milk for 15 at least the first 6 months of life, as recommended by the American 16 Academy of Pediatrics;
- 17 (3) To further enable women to breast feed while giving 18 appropriate and adequate complementary foods to children for up to 19 2 years of age or beyond; and
- 20 (4) To create an appropriate environment of awareness and 21 support so that women can breast feed and thereby achieve an ideal 22 child nutrition option.
- 23 §16-43-2. Child's right to nurse; location where permitted; right 24 protected.
- 25 (a) A woman has the right to breast feed her child or children 26 in any location, public or private, where she has the right to be

- 1 with her child, without respect to whether the woman's breast or
- 2 any part of it is uncovered during or incidental to the breast
- 3 feeding of her child.
