18	§30-3-7a. Findings and Rule-making authority.
19	(a) The Legislature finds that it is appropriate and in the
20	public interest to require the Board of Medicine to regulate the
21	practice of Radiologist Assistants.
22	(b) The West Virginia Board of Medicine, with the advice of
23	the West Virginia Medical Imaging and Radiation Therapy Technology

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1 Board of Examiners, shall propose rules for legislative approval, 2 in accordance with the provisions of article three, chapter twenty-3 nine-a of this code, to:

4 (1) Establish the scope of practice of a Radiologist 5 Assistant;

6 (2) Develop the education and training requirements for a 7 Radiologist Assistant. <u>The certification examination given by the</u> 8 <u>American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT) and the</u> 9 <u>certification examination given by the Certification Board for</u> 10 <u>Radiology Practitioner Assistants (CRBRPA) shall be acceptable</u> 11 <u>qualifying examinations for licensure as a radiologic assistant</u>; 12 and

13 (3) Regulate Radiologist Assistants.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to make the practice of radiologic assistants and radiologic practitioner assistants who are regulated by the Board of Medicine.
