7	FISCAL NOTE
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10	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by
11	adding thereto a new article, designated \$22-29-1, \$22-29-2,
12	\$22-29-3, $$22-29-4$ , $$22-29-5$ and $$22-29-6$ , all relating to the
13	adoption of green building standards for the construction or
14	renovation of public buildings over five thousand square feet
15	in size.
16	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
17	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended
18	by adding thereto a new article, designated \$22-29-1, \$22-29-2,
19	\$22-29-3, $$22-29-4$ , $$22-29-5$ and $$22-29-6$ , all to read as follows:
20	ARTICLE 29. GREEN BUILDINGS.
21	§22-29-1. Short title and effective date.
22	This article is called the "Green Buildings Act."
23	§22-29-2. Findings and purpose.
24	(a) The Legislature finds that:

- 1 (1) Energy costs for public buildings are skyrocketing and
- 2 will likely continue to increase.
- 3 (2) Energy use by public buildings contributes substantially
- 4 to the problems of pollution and global warming.
- 5 (3) Public buildings can be built and renovated using high-
- 6 performance methods that save energy costs, preserve the
- 7 environment, and make workers and students more productive.
- 8 (b) This article is enacted to more efficiently spend public
- 9 funds and protect the health and welfare of West Virginia
- 10 residents.
- 11 §22-29-3. Green buildings.
- 12 As used in this section:
- 13 (1) "Department" means the Department of Administration.
- 14 (2) "LEED silver standard" means the United States Green
- 15 Building Council Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design
- 16 green building rating standard referred to as silver standard.
- 17 (3) "Major facility project" means:
- 18 (A) A building construction project larger than five thousand
- 19 gross square feet of occupied or conditioned space; or
- 20 (B) A building renovation project when the cost is greater
- 21 than fifty percent of the assessed value and the project is larger
- 22 than five thousand gross square feet of occupied or conditioned
- 23 space.
- 24 (4) "Public agency" means every state office, board,

- 1 commission, committee, bureau, department or public institution of
- 2 higher education, including counties and municipalities.
- 3 §22-29-4. Green building standards.
- 4 (a) All major facility projects of public agencies shall be
- 5 designed, constructed and certified to at least the LEED silver
- 6 standard. This provision applies to major facility projects that
- 7 have not entered the design phase prior to July 1, 2011.
- 8 (b) All major facility projects of a public school district,
- 9 where the project receives any state funding, shall be designed,
- 10 constructed and certified to at least the LEED silver standard.
- 11 This provision applies to major facility projects that have not
- 12 entered the design phase prior to January 1, 2012.
- 13 (c) All major facility projects by any person, corporation or
- 14 entity other than a public agency or public school district, where
- 15 the project receives any state funding, shall be designed,
- 16 constructed and certified to at least the LEED silver standard.
- 17 This provision applies to major facility projects that have not
- 18 entered the grant application process prior to January 1, 2012.
- 19 (d) A major facility project does not have to meet the LEED
- 20 silver standard if:
- 21 (1) There is no appropriate LEED silver standard for that type
- 22 of building or renovation project. In such case, the department
- 23 will set lesser green building standards that are appropriate to
- 24 the project.

- 1 (2) There is no practical way to apply the LEED silver
- 2 standard to a particular building or renovation project. In such
- 3 case, the department will set lesser green building standards that
- 4 are appropriate to the project.
- 5 (3) The building or renovation project is an electricity
- 6 transmitter building, a water pumping station or a hospital.

## 7 §22-29-5. Administration and reports.

- 8 (a) The department shall propose such rules for legislative
- 9 approval as are necessary to enforce this article in accordance
- 10 with the provisions of article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this
- 11 code. Those rules shall include how the department will determine
- 12 whether a project qualifies for an exception from the LEED silver
- 13 standard, and the lesser green building standards that may be
- 14 imposed on projects that are granted exceptions.
- 15 (b) The department shall monitor and document ongoing
- 16 operating savings that result from major facility projects
- 17 designed, constructed and certified as meeting the LEED silver
- 18 standard and annually publish a public report of findings and
- 19 recommended changes in policy. The report shall also include a
- 20 description of projects that were granted exceptions from the LEED
- 21 silver standard, the reasons for exceptions, and the lesser green
- 22 building standards imposed.
- 23 (c) The department shall create a green buildings advisory
- 24 committee composed of representatives from the design and

- 1 construction industry involved in public works contracting,
- 2 personnel from affected public agencies and school boards that
- 3 oversee public works projects, and others at the department's
- 4 discretion to provide advice on implementing this section. The
- 5 advisory committee shall make recommendations regarding an
- 6 education and training process and an ongoing evaluation or
- 7 feedback process to help the department implement this section.

## 8 §22-29-6. Protection from liability.

- 9 No person, corporation or entity may be held liable for the
- 10 failure of a major facility project to meet the LEED silver
- 11 standard or other standard established for the project as long as
- 12 a good faith attempt was made to achieve the standard set for the
- 13 project.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is for the adoption of green building standards for the construction or renovation of public buildings over five thousand square feet in size.

The article is new; therefore, it has been completely underscored.
