2           older than seven weeks.

3           (a) When a facility provides abortions, it is responsible for  
4 ensuring that anesthesia is administered to an unborn fetus who is  
5 aborted if it is older than seven weeks. The kind of anesthesia  
6 used, and the method of administering the anesthesia, shall conform  
7 to medical standards used in fetal surgery.

8           (b) Any facility or person violating the requirements of this  
9 section is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof,  
10 shall be fined not less than \$1,000 nor more than \$5,000 and, if an  
11 individual, confined in jail no less than six months nor more than  
12 one year, or both fined and confined.

13           (c) Nothing contained in this section endorses, allows,  
14 permits or approves of any abortion.

15 **§33-42-10. Requirement to preserve life when fetus aborted alive.**

16           (a) In cases in which, during the course of an abortion  
17 procedure, a fetus is aborted alive, the facility in which the  
18 abortion is performed and all individuals directly involved in  
19 performing the abortion shall use all available medical means to  
20 preserve, promote and maintain the life of the fetus.

21           (b) Any person who violates the provisions of this section is  
22 guilty of a felony and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not  
23 less than \$1,000 nor more than \$5,000 or imprisoned in a state  
24 correctional facility for not less than one nor more than three

1 years, or both fined and imprisoned.

2 (c) Nothing in this section endorses, allows, permits or

3 approves of any abortion.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require medical facilities that provide abortions to administer anesthesia to an unborn fetus when aborted, if it is older than seven weeks. It also provides that when, during the course of an abortion procedure, a fetus is aborted alive, all available medical means must be used to preserve its life. The bill provides criminal penalties for violations.

These sections are new; therefore, they have been completely underscored.
