- 2 (a) Effective July 1, 2011, vaccines administered within the
- 3 state may not contain mercury or mercury compounds, including, but
- 4 not limited to, thimerosal, unless:
- 5 (1) A specific vaccine that does not contain mercury is not
- 6 manufactured; or
- 7 (2) A mercury-free vaccine is not available despite using
- 8 best efforts to secure that vaccine.
- 9 (b) If, in accordance with subsection (a), a mercury-free
- 10 vaccine is unavailable, a vaccine that contains a trace amount of
- 11 mercury, as defined by the United States Food and Drug
- 12 Administration, may be administered.
- 13 (c) If a mercury-free vaccine or a vaccine that contains a

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to eliminate, to the maximum extent possible, the use of vaccines that contain mercury.
