14	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
15	That \$25-1-11d of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
16	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
17	ARTICLE 1. ORGANIZATION, INSTITUTIONS AND CORRECTIONS MANAGEMENT.
18	§25-1-11d. Compensation of employees approved by commissioner;
19	traveling and other expenses; payment of salaries.
20	The Commissioner of Corrections shall approve the salaries of
21	all employees of the Division of Corrections. Salaries shall be
22	commensurate with their duties and responsibilities, but no meals
23	or other emoluments of any kind shall be furnished, given or paid

1 to the employee as all or part of their salary. The employees may 2 be provided meals, household facilities and supplies as may be 3 necessary for them to perform their duties, if the employees agree 4 to pay the reasonable cost as established by the Commissioner of 5 Corrections. In the event of If there is an emergency, such as a 6 riot or other disturbance, the commissioner may authorize meals be 7 provided to employees at no cost. Additionally, the commissioner 8 may establish a procedure to reimburse employees reasonable costs 9 in the event the employee's personal property is stolen or damaged 10 by an inmate. All persons employed under this article are entitled 11 to be reimbursed for necessary traveling and other expenses. 12 salaries, expenses and appropriations provided for the employees 13 under the commissioner's jurisdiction shall be paid in the same 14 manner as are those of other state employees and agencies and on a 15 payment schedule set forth by the State Auditor. 16 Notwithstanding any provision of this code to the contrary, 17 correctional officers shall be allowed to retire after twenty years 18 of honorable and actual service, with full benefits under the 19 provisions of article ten, chapter five of this code. The Public 20 Employees Retirement Board of Trustees is hereby directed to propose

21 rules for legislative approval in accordance with the provisions of

22 article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code designed to

23 implement the retirement of correctional officers provided herein.

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NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide that correctional officers may retire with full benefits after twenty years of actual and honorable service.
