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10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$18A-3-1$ of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended, relating to teacher certification; and
12	allowing teachers who graduated from colleges and universities
13	that are not accredited by associations recognized in West
14	Virginia, to obtain a teaching certificate based on their
15	certification in another state of at least ten years.
16	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
17	That §18A-3-1 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
18	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
19	ARTICLE 3. TRAINING, CERTIFICATION, LICENSING, PROFESSIONAL
20	DEVELOPMENT.
21	\$18A-3-1. Teacher preparation programs; program approval and
22	standards; authority to issue teaching certificates.
23	(a) The education of professional educators in the state is

1 under the general direction and control of the state board after 2 consultation with the Secretary of Education and the Arts and the 3 Chancellor for Higher Education who shall represent the interests 4 of educator preparation programs within the institutions of higher 5 education in this state as those institutions are defined in 6 section two, article one, chapter eighteen-b of this code.

7 The education of professional educators in the state includes 8 all programs leading to certification to teach or serve in the 9 public schools including:

10 (1) Those programs in all institutions of higher education,11 including student teaching as provided in this section;

12 (2) Beginning teacher internship programs;

13 (3) The granting of West Virginia certification to persons who
14 received their preparation to teach outside the boundaries of this
15 state, except as provided in subsection (b) of this section;

16 (4) Any alternative preparation programs in this state leading 17 to certification, including programs established pursuant to 18 section 1-a of this article and programs which are in effect on the 19 effective date of this section; and

20 (5) Any continuing professional education, professional 21 development and in-service training programs for professional 22 educators employed in the public schools in the state.

(b) The state board, after consultation with the Secretary of24 Education and the Arts and the Chancellor for Higher Education,

1 shall adopt standards for the education of professional educators 2 in the state and for awarding certificates valid in the public 3 schools of this state. The standards shall include, but not be 4 limited to the following:

5 (1) A provision for The study of multicultural education. As 6 used in this section, multicultural education means the study of 7 the pluralistic nature of American society including its values, 8 institutions, organizations, groups, status positions and social 9 roles;

10 (2) A provision for The study of classroom management 11 techniques, including methods of effective management of disruptive 12 behavior which shall include societal factors and their impact on 13 student behavior; and

14 (3) Subject to the provisions of section ten of this article, 15 a teacher from another state shall be awarded a teaching 16 certificate for a comparable grade level and subject area valid in 17 the public schools of this state, if he or she:

18 (A) Holds a valid teaching certificate or a certificate of19 eligibility issued by another state;

20 (B) Has graduated from an educator preparation program at a 21 regionally accredited institution of higher education;

(C) Possesses the minimum of a bachelor's degree; and
(D) Meets all of the requirements of the state for full
certification except employment.

1 <u>(E) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, this</u> 2 code, or any other provision of rule or law, any person who holds 3 <u>a valid teaching certificate from another state and has held said</u> 4 <u>certificate for a period of ten years or longer, regardless of the</u> 5 <u>school or university accreditation from which they graduated, and</u> 6 <u>meets all other requirements for certification set forth in this</u> 7 <u>article, shall be in compliance with the requirements of the State</u> 8 of West Virginia for teacher certification.

9 (c) To give prospective teachers the teaching experience needed 10 to demonstrate competence as a prerequisite to certification to 11 teach in the West Virginia public schools, the state board may 12 enter into an agreement with county boards for the use of the 13 public schools.

(d) An agreement established pursuant to subsection (c) of this section shall recognize student teaching as a joint responsibility of the educator preparation institution and the cooperating public schools and shall include:

18 (1) The minimum qualifications for the employment of public 19 school teachers selected as supervising teachers, including the 20 requirement that field-based and clinical experiences be supervised 21 by a teacher fully certified in the state in which that teacher is 22 supervising;

23 (2) The remuneration to be paid public school teachers by the 24 state board, in addition to their contractual salaries, for

1 supervising student teachers;

2 (3) Minimum standards to guarantee the adequacy of the 3 facilities and program of the public school selected for student 4 teaching;

5 (4) That the student teacher, under the direction and 6 supervision of the supervising teacher, shall exercise the 7 authority of a substitute teacher; and

8 (5) A provision requiring That any higher education institution 9 with an educator preparation program to <u>shall</u> document that the 10 student teacher's field-based and clinical experiences include 11 participation and instruction with multicultural, at-risk and 12 exceptional children at each programmatic level for which the 13 student teacher seeks certification.

(e) Beginning <u>in</u> the fall 2006 - 2007 academic term, in lieu of the student teaching experience in a public school setting required by this section, an institution of higher education may provide an alternate student teaching experience in a nonpublic school setting l8 if the institution of higher education:

19 (1) Complies with the provisions of this section;

20 (2) Has a state board approved educator preparation program;21 and

(3) Enters into an agreement pursuant to subdivisions (f) and(g) of this section.

24 (f) At the discretion of the higher education institution, an

1 agreement for an alternate student teaching experience between an 2 institution of higher education and a nonpublic school shall 3 require that either:

4 (1) The student teacher complete at least one half of the 5 clinical experience in a public school; or

6 (2) The educator preparation program include a requirement that 7 any student performing student teaching in a nonpublic school 8 complete at least:

9 (A) Two hundred clock hours of field-based training in a public 10 school; and

(B) A course, which is a component of the institution's state l2 board approved educator preparation program, that provides to l3 prospective teachers information that is equivalent to the teaching l4 experience needed to demonstrate competence as a prerequisite to l5 certification to teach in the public schools in West Virginia. The l6 course shall include instruction on at least the following l7 elements:

18 (i) State board policy and provisions of this code governing 19 public education;

20 (ii) Requirements for federal and state accountability, 21 including the mandatory reporting of child abuse;

(iii) Federal and state mandated curriculum and assessment requirements, including multicultural education, safe schools and student code of conduct;

1 (iv) Federal and state regulations for the instruction of 2 exceptional students as defined by the Individuals with 3 Disabilities Education Act, 20 U.S.C. §1400 *et seq.*;

4 (v) Varied approaches for effective instruction for students5 who are at-risk;

6 (g) In addition to the requirements set forth in subsection (f) 7 of this section, an agreement for an alternate student teaching 8 experience between an institution of higher education and a 9 nonpublic school shall:

10 (1) Require that the higher education institution with an 11 educator preparation program document that the student teacher's 12 field-based and clinical experiences include participation and 13 instruction with multicultural, at-risk and exceptional children at 14 each programmatic level for which the student teacher seeks 15 certification; and

16 (2) Include the minimum qualifications for the employment of 17 school teachers selected as supervising teachers, including the 18 requirement that field-based and clinical experiences be supervised 19 by a teacher fully certified in the state in which that teacher is 20 supervising.

(h) The state superintendent may issue certificates to graduates of educator preparation programs and alternative educator preparation programs approved by the state board. The certificates are issued in accordance with this section and rules adopted by the

state board after consultation with the Secretary of Education and
 the Arts and the Chancellor for Higher Education.

3 (1) A certificate to teach may be granted only to any person 4 who is:

5 (A) A citizen of the United States, except as provided in 6 subdivision (2) of this subsection;

7 (B) Is of good moral character;

8 (C) Physically, mentally and emotionally qualified to perform 9 the duties of a teacher; and

10 (D) At least eighteen years on or before the first day of 11 October 1 of the year in which his or her certificate is issued.

12 (2) A permit to teach in the public schools of this state may 13 be granted to a person who is an exchange teacher from a foreign 14 country, or an alien person who meets the requirements to teach.

15 (i) In consultation with the Secretary of Education and the 16 Arts and the Chancellor for Higher Education, institutions of 17 higher education approved for educator preparation may cooperate 18 with each other, with the center for professional development and 19 with one or more county boards to organize and operate centers to 20 provide selected phases of the educator preparation program. The 21 phases include, but are not limited to:

22 (1) Student teaching;

23 (2) Beginning teacher internship programs;

24 (3) Instruction in methodology; and

1 (4) Seminar programs for college students, teachers with 2 provisional certification, professional support team members and 3 supervising teachers.

4 The institutions of higher education, the center for 5 professional development and county boards may by mutual agreement 6 budget and expend funds to operate the centers through payments to 7 the appropriate fiscal office of the participating institutions, 8 the center for professional development and the county boards.

9 (j) The provisions of This section does not require 10 discontinuation of an existing student teacher training center or 11 school which meets the standards of the state board.

12 (k) All institutions of higher education approved for educator 13 preparation in the 1962-1963 school year shall continue to hold 14 that distinction so long as they meet the minimum standards for 15 educator preparation. Nothing in this section infringes upon the 16 rights granted to any institution by charter given according to law 17 previous to the adoption of this code.

(1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, <u>or</u> 19 <u>this code</u>, <u>nor or</u> any other provision of rule <u>or</u> law or this code 20 to the contrary, an institution of higher education may enter into 21 an agreement with a nonpublic school:

22 (1) For the purposes of this section regarding student23 teaching;

24 (2) For the spring, 2006 academic term only;

(3) If the institution is approved for educator preparation by
 2 the state board; and

3 (4) If the institution had entered into the agreement for that 4 academic term prior to the effective date of this section.

5 (m) As used in this section:

6 (1) "Nonpublic school" means a private school, parochial 7 school, church school, school operated by a religious order or 8 other nonpublic school that elects to:

9 (A) Comply with the provisions of article twenty-eight, chapter 10 eighteen of this code;

(B) Participate on a voluntary basis in a state operated or state sponsored program provided to such schools pursuant to this section; and

14 (C) Comply with the provisions of this section;

15 (2) "At-risk" means having the potential for academic failure, 16 including, but not limited to, the risk of dropping out of school, 17 involvement in delinquent activity or poverty as indicated by free 18 or reduced lunch status; and

19 (3) "Exceptional children" has the meaning ascribed pursuant to 20 section one, article twenty, chapter eighteen of this code, but 21 does not include gifted students.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to allow teachers who graduated from colleges and universities that are not accredited by associations recognized in West Virginia, to obtain a teaching

certificate based on their certification in another state of at least ten years.
