- 3 for any simple negligence arising from the volunteer's acts or

- 6 (b) The limitation of liability established by this section
- 7 does not apply to intentional tortious conduct or acts or omissions
- 8 constituting gross <u>negligence</u>.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide immunity from civil damages for persons who volunteer their services to a Public Health Department.
