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10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$17-2A-8$ of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended, relating to the powers and duties of the
12	West Virginia Commissioner of Highways; and authorizing the
13	commissioner to use recycled materials in construction or
14	maintenance of roads and highways.
15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That $\$17-2A-8$ of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
17	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
18	ARTICLE 2A. WEST VIRGINIA COMMISSIONER OF HIGHWAYS.
19	§17-2A-8. Powers, duties and responsibilities of commissioner.
20	In addition to all other duties, powers and responsibilities
21	given and assigned to the commissioner in this chapter, the
22	commissioner may:
23	(1) Exercise general supervision over the state road program
24	and the construction, reconstruction, repair and maintenance of
25	state roads and highways, and shall require the use of recycled

1 material, such as old pavement, concrete and used tires in the 2 construction, reconstruction, repair and maintenance of state roads 3 and highways when those materials are available;

4 (2) Determine the various methods of road construction best 5 adapted to the various sections and areas of the state and 6 establish standards for the construction and maintenance of roads 7 and highways in the various sections and areas of the state;

8 (3) Conduct investigations and experiments, hold hearings and 9 public meetings and attend and participate in meetings and 10 conferences within and without the state for purposes of acquiring 11 information, making findings and determining courses of action and 12 procedure relative to advancement and improvement of the state road 13 and highway system;

14 (4) Enter private lands to make inspections and surveys for 15 road and highway purposes;

16 (5) Acquire, in name of the department, by lease, grant, right 17 of eminent domain or other lawful means all lands and interests and 18 rights in lands necessary and required for roads, rights-of-way, 19 cuts, fills, drains, storage for equipment and materials and road 20 construction and maintenance in general;

(6) Procure photostatic copies of any or all public records on 22 file at the State Capitol of Virginia which may be considered 23 necessary or proper in ascertaining the location and legal status 24 of public road rights-of-way located or established in what is now

1 the State of West Virginia, which when certified by the 2 commissioner, may be admitted in evidence, in lieu of the original, 3 in any of the courts of this state;

4 (7) Plan for and hold annually a school of good roads, of not 5 less than three or more than six days' duration, for instruction of 6 his or her employees, which is held in conjunction with West 7 Virginia University and may be held at the university or at any 8 other suitable place in the state;

9 (8) Negotiate and enter in reciprocal contracts and agreements 10 with proper authorities of other states and of the United States 11 relating to and regulating the use of roads and highways with 12 reference to weights and types of vehicles, registration of 13 vehicles and licensing of operators, military and emergency 14 movements of personnel and supplies and all other matters of 15 interstate or national interest;

16 (9) Classify and reclassify, locate and relocate, expressway, 17 trunkline, feeder and state local service roads and designate by 18 number the routes within the state road system;

(10) Create, extend or establish, upon petition of any 20 interested party or parties or on the commissioner's own 21 initiative, any new road or highway found necessary and proper;

(11) Exercise jurisdiction, control, supervision and authority
over local roads, outside the state road system, to the extent
determined by him or her to be expedient and practicable;

1 (12) Discontinue, vacate and close any road or highway, or any 2 part of any road or highway, the continuance and maintenance of 3 which are found unnecessary and improper, upon petition and hearing 4 or upon investigation initiated by the commissioner;

5 (13) Close any state road while under construction or repair 6 and provide a temporary road during the time of the construction or 7 repair;

8 (14) Adjust damages occasioned by construction, reconstruction 9 or repair of any state road or the establishment of any temporary 10 road;

11 (15) Establish and maintain a uniform system of road signs and 12 markers;

(16) Fix standard widths for road rights-of-way, bridges and 14 approaches to bridges and fix and determine grades and elevations 15 therefor;

16 (17) Test and standardize materials used in road construction 17 and maintenance, either by governmental testing and standardization 18 activities or through contract by private agencies;

19 (18) Allocate the cost of retaining walls and drainage 20 projects, for the protection of a state road or its right-of-way, 21 to the cost of construction, reconstruction, improvement or 22 maintenance;

(19) Acquire, establish, construct, maintain and operate, in24 the name of the department, roadside recreational areas along and

1 adjacent to state roads and highways;

2 (20) Exercise general supervision over the construction and 3 maintenance of airports and landing fields under the jurisdiction 4 of the West Virginia State Aeronautics Commission, of which the 5 commissioner is a member, and make a study and general plan of a 6 statewide system of airports and landing fields;

7 (21) Provide traffic engineering services to municipalities of
8 the state upon request of the governing body of any municipality
9 and upon terms that are agreeably arranged;

10 (22) Institute complaints before the Public Service Commission 11 or any other appropriate governmental agency relating to freight 12 rates, car service and movement of road materials and equipment;

13 (23) Invoke any appropriate legal or equitable remedies to 14 enforce his or her orders, to compel compliance with requirements 15 of law and to protect and preserve the state road and highway 16 system or any part of the system;

17 (24) Make and promulgate rules for the government and conduct 18 of personnel, for the orderly and efficient administration and 19 supervision of the state road program and for the effective and 20 expeditious performance and discharge of the duties and 21 responsibilities placed upon him or her by law;

(25) Delegate powers and duties to his or her appointees and and employees who shall act by and under his or her direction and be responsible to him or her for their acts;

1 (26) Designate and define any construction and maintenance 2 districts within the state road system that is found expedient and 3 practicable;

4 (27) Contract for the construction, improvement and 5 maintenance of the roads;

6 (28) Comply with provisions of present and future federal aid 7 statutes and regulations, including execution of contracts or 8 agreements with and cooperation in programs of the United States 9 government and any proper department, bureau or agency of the 10 United States government relating to plans, surveys, construction, 11 reconstruction, improvement and maintenance of state roads and 12 highways;

13 (29) Prepare budget estimates and requests;

14 (30) Establish a system of accounting covering and including 15 all fiscal and financial matters of the department;

16 (31) Establish and advance a right-of-way acquisition 17 revolving fund, a materials revolving fund and an equipment 18 revolving fund;

19 (32) Enter into contracts and agreements with and cooperate in 20 programs of counties, municipalities and other governmental 21 agencies and subdivisions of the state relating to plans, surveys, 22 construction, reconstruction, improvement, maintenance and 23 supervision of highways, roads, streets and other travel ways when 24 and to the extent determined by the department to be expedient and

1 practical;

2 (33) Report, as provided by law, to the Governor and the 3 Legislature;

4 (34) Purchase materials, supplies and equipment required for 5 the state road program and system;

6 (35) Dispose of all obsolete and unusable and surplus supplies 7 and materials which cannot be used advantageously and beneficially 8 by the department in the state road program by transfer of the 9 supplies and materials to other governmental agencies and 10 institutions by exchange, trade or sale of the supplies and 11 materials;

12 (36) Investigate road conditions, official conduct of 13 department personnel and fiscal and financial affairs of the 14 department and hold hearings and make findings thereon or on any 15 other matters within the jurisdiction of the department;

16 (37) Establish road policies and administrative practices;
17 (38) Fix and revise from time to time tolls for transit over

18 highway projects constructed by the Division of Highways after May
19 1, 1999, that have been authorized by the provisions of section
20 five-b, article seventeen-a of this chapter;

(39) Take actions necessary to alleviate any conditions as the 22 Governor may declare to constitute an emergency, whether or not the 23 emergency condition affects areas normally under the jurisdiction 24 of the Department of Highways; and

1 (40) Provide family restrooms at all rest areas along 2 interstate highways in this state, all to be constructed in 3 accordance with federal law.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require the West Virginia Commissioner of Highways to use recycled materials in construction or maintenance of roads and highways.
