19	<u>§61-5-30. Reporting of violent acts and emergency situations;</u>

21	(a) When any person sees, witnesses or otherwise is aware of
22	an act of violence against another person or a situation that
23	constitutes an emergency, that person shall immediately notify, or

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1 otherwise inform, the local police, the county sheriff or State
2 Police in a way that will permit that law-enforcement authority to
3 respond in a timely manner. However, the notification may be made
4 anonymously.
5 (b) Any person who, in good faith, reports any act required by
6 this section is immune from civil or criminal liability that might
7 otherwise result by reason of such actions.
8 (c) When any person required by this section to report an act
9 of violence against another person or a situation that constitutes
10 an emergency knowingly fails to report an incident that results in
11 the death of an innocent individual, that person is guilty of a
12 misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be confined in jail
13 for not more than ten days or fined not more than \$500, or both.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require witnesses of violet acts against persons and emergency situations to report the incidents to the appropriate law-enforcement authorities.
