Dog killing, wounding or worrying livestock or 20 poultry -- Recovery of damages. 21 If any a dog has killed or assisted in killing, wounding or 22 worrying any sheep, lambs, goats, kids, calves, cattle, swine, show 23 or breeding rabbits, horses, colts, cats or poultry out of the 24 enclosure of the owner of the dog, the owner or keeper of the dog 25 shall be is liable for the sheep, lambs, goats, kids, calves, 26 cattle, swine, show or breeding rabbits, horses, colts, cats or

1 poultry in the amount of the damages sustained, to be recovered in 2 an action before any court or magistrate having jurisdiction of the 3 action. It shall is not be necessary to sustain the action to 4 prove that the owner of the dog knew the dog was accustomed to 5 worrying, killing or wounding. A recovery under this section shall 6 bar and preclude bars the owner of the sheep, lambs, goats, kids, 7 calves, cattle, swine, show or breeding rabbits, horses, colts, 8 cats or poultry from obtaining compensation from the county 9 commission under the provisions of this article. If the person 10 suffering the loss or damage cannot ascertain the owner or keeper 11 of the dog, or if the owner or keeper is not financially 12 responsible, then the person suffering the loss or damage may file 13 his or her claim with and prove the same it before the county 14 commission of the county in which the loss or damage is sustained, 15 in the manner provided in this article, and the commission shall 16 pay the loss or damage out of the fund provided for such purposes 17 and according to the provisions of this article. ## 24 §19-20-16. Same -- When lawful to kill dog.

A person may kill a dog that he may see or she sees chasing, wounding or killing any sheep, lambs, goats, kids,

- 1 calves, cattle, swine, show or breeding rabbits, horses, colts,
- 2 cats or poultry outside of the enclosure of the owner of the dog,
- 3 unless the chasing or worrying  $\frac{be}{}$  is done  $\frac{by}{}$  at the direction of
- 4 the owner of the sheep, lambs, goats, kids, calves, cattle, swine,
- 5 show or breeding rabbits or horses and colts, cats or poultry.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to protect cats from injury by dogs who run loose by both imposing liability on the dog owner and by permitting a person to kill a dog when the dog is observed chasing, wounding, worrying or killing a cat.
