10	A BILL to amend and reenact §19-14-5 of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended, relating to providing moneys from an
12	additional commercial feed distributor fee assessed to
13	commercial feed distributors to fund a statewide spay and
14	neuter program; and creating the Spay Neuter Assistance Fund.
15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That §19-14-5 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
17	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
18	ARTICLE 14. WEST VIRGINIA COMMERCIAL FEED LAW.
19	§19-14-5. Permits; registration.
20	(a) Permits and registrations shall not be <u>are not</u>
21	transferrable with respect to persons or locations.
22	(b) A person must apply for a permit or registration at least
23	fifteen days prior to before the expiration of the current permit
24	or registration expires; or at least fifteen days prior to before
25	the date that the person intends to engage in business or market

- 1 products in this state. All applications shall be accompanied by
- 2 the fee established in this section. A penalty of \$2 shall be
- 3 added to the fee for all permits or registrations that are not
- 4 applied for or renewed within the time limit.
- 5 (c) Persons manufacturing commercial feed or customer-formula
- 6 feed in this state must obtain a Commercial Feed Manufacturing
- 7 Permit, except all persons manufacturing feed for only his or her
- 8 animals on his or her premises. Application forms shall be
- 9 provided by the commissioner and include such information as
- 10 established by rules. A separate permit shall be obtained for each
- 11 manufacturing facility or location in this state. Each Commercial
- 12 Feed Manufacturing Permit application shall be accompanied by an
- 13 application fee of \$15. Each permit issued shall expire expires on
- 14 December 31 next following the date of issue.
- 15 (d) Each person first distributing commercial feed into West
- 16 Virginia trade channels must obtain a Commercial Feed Distributor
- 17 Permit, except: (1) Persons distributing pet food exclusively, (2)
- 18 persons holding a valid Commercial Feed Manufacturing Permit, and
- 19 (3) persons distributing only those feeds that they register.
- 20 Application forms shall be provided by the commissioner and include
- 21 such information as established by rules. Each Commercial Feed
- 22 Distributor Permit application shall be accompanied by an
- 23 application fee of \$10: Provided, That the commissioner shall
- 24 establish by rule an additional commercial feed distributor permit

- 1 fee of not less than \$5 per year to be deposited in the Spay Neuter
- 2 Assistance Fund hereby created, for the purposes of funding the
- 3 Spay Neuter Assistance Program of West Virginia, Inc., a 26 U.S.C.
- 4 §501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation: Provided, however, That this
- 5 fund also consists of moneys from gifts, donations or any
- 6 appropriations by the Legislature. Each permit issued shall expire
- 7 expires on December 31 next following the date of issue.
- 8 (e) All commercial feed distributed or used in this state,
- 9 except customer-formula feed, must be registered. Commercial feed
- 10 that can be uniquely identified by its brand name, product name,
- 11 physical form or other descriptive term shall be registered as a
- 12 separate product. Commercial feed that is packaged in such weights
- 13 as to apply to several categories shall be registered in each
- 14 applicable category. Application forms shall be provided by the
- 15 commissioner and include such information as established by rules.
- 16 (1) Commercial feed, other than pet food, in packages over ten
- 17 pounds or bulk shall be registered permanently. A registration fee
- 18 of \$10 per product shall accompany each application for
- 19 registration, except that there will be no fee for a revision of a
- 20 commercial feed already on file that involves a change in the net
- 21 weight, a change in the list of ingredients, and/ or a change in
- 22 the guarantee for vitamins or minerals.
- 23 (2) On August 31, 1991, permanent registrations for pet food
- 24 in packages over ten pounds are void and application for

- 1 registration and payment of fees will be required. Pet food,
- 2 including specialty pet foods, in packages over ten pounds or bulk
- 3 shall be registered annually. A registration fee of \$50 per
- 4 product shall accompany each application for registration. The
- 5 registration $\frac{\text{shall expire}}{\text{expires on}}$ August 31 next following the
- 6 date of issue.
- 7 (3) Commercial feed, excluding specialty pet food in packages
- 8 of one pound or less, in packages of ten pounds and under shall be
- 9 registered annually. A registration fee of \$40 per product shall
- 10 accompany each application for registration. The registration
- 11 shall expire expires on December 31 next following the date of
- 12 issue.
- 13 (4) Specialty pet food in packages of one pound or less shall
- 14 be registered annually. A registration fee of \$20 per product
- 15 shall accompany each application for registration. The
- 16 registration shall expire expires on December 31 next following the
- 17 date of issue.
- 18 (f) A person is not required to register any brand name or
- 19 product name of commercial feed which is already registered by
- 20 another person.
- 21 (g) Alteration of commercial feed that changes the label
- 22 requires a new application for a Commercial Feed Registration be
- 23 made and approved before distribution.

NOTE: This bill creates the Spay Neuter Assistance Fund moneys from an additional commercial feed distributor fee assessed to commercial feed distributors.
