10	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by
11	adding thereto a new section, designated \$21-3-22, relating to
12	requiring onsite employees at certain public works
13	construction projects to complete an Occupational Safety and
14	Health Administration (OSHA) approved 10-hour construction
15	safety program prior to beginning work; civil penalties; and
16	exemptions.
17	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
18	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended
19	by adding thereto a new section, designated §21-3-22, to read as
20	follows:
21	ARTICLE 3. SAFETY AND WELFARE OF EMPLOYEES.
22	§21-3-22. OSHA safety construction program.
23	(a) Any person submitting a bid for, or signing a contract to
24	work on, the construction, reconstruction, alteration, remodeling
25	or repairs of any public work by the state, or political
26	subdivision thereof or by any county gity town district where

- 1 the total cost of all work to be performed by all contractors and
- 2 subcontractors in connection with the contract is at least a cost
- 3 of \$1,000 or more, shall have an Occupational Safety and Health
- 4 Administration (OSHA) 10-hour construction safety program for their
- 5 on-site employees.
- 6 (1) All employees are required to complete the program prior
- 7 to beginning work. The training program shall utilize an
- 8 OSHA-approved curriculum. Graduates shall receive a card from OSHA
- 9 certifying the successful completion of the training program.
- 10 (2) Any employee found on a worksite subject to this section
- 11 without documentation of successful completion of a course in
- 12 construction safety and health approved by the United States
- 13 Occupational Safety and Health Administration that is at least 10
- 14 hours in duration shall be subject to immediate removal.
- 15 (3) All contractors and subcontractors must attach a copy of
- 16 proof of completion of the OSHA 10 course by submitting a course
- 17 completion card issued by the federal Occupational Safety and
- 18 Health Administration Training Institute to the first certified
- 19 payroll submitted to the contracting agency and on each succeeding
- 20 payroll where any new or additional employee is first listed.
- 21 (b) The labor commissioner may assess a civil penalty of up to
- 22 \$3,000. In addition such an employer shall be assessed a civil
- 23 penalty of \$500 per employee for each day of noncompliance.
- 24 (c) The following individuals are exempt from the requirements
- 25 of the OSHA 10-hour construction safety program:

- 1 (1) Law-enforcement officers involved with traffic control or
- 2 job site security;
- 3 (2) All relevant federal, state and municipal government
- 4 employees and inspectors; and
- 5 (3) All delivery personnel.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require onsite employees at certain public works construction projects to complete an Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) approved 10-hour construction safety program prior to beginning work.

This section is new; therefore, it has been completely underscored.
