- 2 (a) The Legislature finds it is in the best interest of the
- 3 state to have a rule establishing guidelines under which a member
- 4 of a state professional licensing board may serve concurrently as
- 5 <u>an officer of a state professional association and to ensure that</u>
- 6 the concurrent service does not impair the board member's
- 7 <u>impartiality and independent judgment.</u>
- 8 (b) The commission may propose a rule for legislative approval
- 9 in accordance with the provisions of article three, chapter twenty-
- 10 nine-a of this code, to establish guidelines under which a member
- 11 of a professional licensing board governed by the provisions of
- 12 chapter thirty of this code may serve concurrently as an officer of
- 13 <u>a state professional association</u>. The rule may include, but is not
- 14 limited to:

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize the Ethics Commission to promulgate a legislative rule to establish guidelines under which a member of a state professional licensing board may serve concurrently as an officer of a state professional association.
