- 22 (a) The Governor's Office of Economic Opportunity created by
- 23 Executive Order, together with all of its functions, powers and
- 24 duties, is transferred to and constituted under the Office of
- 25 Economic Opportunity in the Department of Commerce.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to transfer the Office of Economic Opportunity from the Governor's Office to the Department of Commerce. The bill establishes the qualification for its director. The bill sets forth the office's powers and duties. The bill also grants the office authority over the weatherization assistance program.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.

Article 2H is new; therefore, it has been completely underscored.
