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10	A BILL to amend and reenact §15-10-5 of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended, relating to the addition of marshals and
12	deputy marshals of the Federal Air Marshal Service to the list
13	of federal law enforcement authorized to act under this
14	section.
15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That §15-10-5 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
17	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
18	ARTICLE 10. COOPERATION BETWEEN LAW-ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES.
19	<pre>§15-10-5. Federal officers' peace-keeping authority.</pre>
20	(a) Notwithstanding any provision of this code to the
21	contrary, any person who is employed by the United States
22	government as a federal law-enforcement officer and is listed in
23	subsection (b) of this section, has the same authority to enforce
24	the laws of this state, except state or local traffic laws or
25	parking ordinances, as that authority granted to state or local
26	law-enforcement officers if one or more of the following
27	circumstances exist:
28	(1) The federal law-enforcement officer is requested to

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1 provide temporary assistance by the head of a state or local law-2 enforcement agency or the designee of the head of the agency and 3 that request is within the state or local law-enforcement agency's 4 scope of authority and jurisdiction and is in writing. *Provided*, 5 ThatProvided, That The request does not need to be in writing if an 6 emergency situation exists involving the imminent risk of loss of 7 life or serious bodily injury;

8 (2) The federal law-enforcement officer is requested by a 9 state or local law-enforcement officer to provide the officer 10 temporary assistance when the state or local law-enforcement 11 officer is acting within the scope of the officer's authority and 12 jurisdiction and where exigent circumstances exist; or

13 (3) A felony is committed in the federal law-enforcement 14 officer's presence or under circumstances indicating a felony has 15 just occurred.

16 (b) This section applies to the following persons who are 17 employed as full-time federal law-enforcement officers by the 18 United States Government and who are authorized to carry firearms 19 while performing their duties:

20 (1) Federal Bureau of Investigation special agents;

21 (2) Drug Enforcement Administration special agents;

(3) United States Marshal's Service marshals and deputy23 marshals;

24 (4) United States Postal Service inspectors;

25 (5) Internal Revenue Service special agents;

26 (6) United States Secret Service special agents;

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(7) Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms special agents;
 (8) Police officers employed pursuant to 40 U.S.C. §§318 and
 490 at the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Criminal Justice
 Information Services Division facility located within this state;
 and

6 (9) Law enforcement commissioned rangers of the National Park
7 Service; and

8 (10) <u>Federal Air Marshal's Service marshals and deputy</u> 9 marshals.

10 (c) Any person acting under the authority granted pursuant to 11 this section:

12 (1) Has the same authority and is subject to the same 13 exemptions and exceptions to this code as a state or local law-14 enforcement officer;

15 (2) Is not an officer, employee, or agent of any state or 16 local law-enforcement agency;

17 (3) May not initiate or conduct an independent investigation 18 into an alleged violation of any provision of this code except to 19 the extent necessary to preserve evidence or testimony at risk of 20 loss immediately following an occurrence described in subdivision 21 (3), subsection (a) of this section;

(4) Is subject to 28 U.S.C. §1346, the Federal Tort Claims23 Act; and

(5) Has the same immunities from liability as a state or locallaw-enforcement officer.

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NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to add marshals and deputy marshals from the Federal Air Marshal Service to the list of federal law enforcement governmental employees who can act under the conditions set forth in this section.
