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10	A BILL to amend and reenact $16-13A-7$ of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended, relating to increasing the expenditure limit

15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That §16-13A-7 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
17	be amended and reenacted, to read as follows:
18	ARTICLE 13A. PUBLIC SERVICE DISTRICTS.
19	<pre>§16-13A-7. Acquisition and operation of district properties.</pre>
20	The board of such these districts shall have the supervision
21	and control of all public service properties acquired or
22	constructed by the district, and shall have the power, and it shall
23	be its duty, to maintain, operate, extend and improve the same,
24	including, but not limited to, those activities necessary to comply
25	with all federal and state requirements, including water quality

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1 improvement activities. All contracts involving the expenditure by 2 the district of more than fifteen thousand dollars \$25,000 for 3 construction work or for the purchase of equipment and 4 improvements, extensions or replacements, shall be entered into 5 only after notice inviting bids shall have been published as a 6 Class I legal advertisement in compliance with the provision of 7 article three, chapter fifty-nine of this code, and the publication 8 area for such publication shall be as specified in section two of 9 this article in the county or counties in which the district is 10 located. The publication shall not be less than ten days prior to 11 the making of any such contract. To the extent allowed by law, in-12 state contractors shall be given first priority in awarding public 13 service district contracts. It shall be the duty of the board to 14 ensure that local in-state labor shall be utilized to the greatest 15 extent possible when hiring laborers for public service district 16 construction or maintenance repair jobs. It shall further be the 17 duty of the board to encourage contractors to use American made 18 products in their construction to the extent possible. Any 19 obligations incurred of any kind or character shall not in any 20 event constitute or be deemed an indebtedness within the meaning of 21 any of the provisions or limitations of the Constitution, but all 22 such obligations shall be payable solely and only out of revenues 23 derived from the operation of the public service properties of the 24 district or from proceeds of bonds issued as hereinafter provided. 25 No continuing contract for the purchase of materials or supplies or

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1 for furnishing the district with electrical energy or power shall

2 be entered into for a longer period than fifteen years.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to increase the expenditure limit from \$15,000 to \$25,000 on public service district construction and purchase contracts before competitive bids are required.
