15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That §15-2-3 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,

19	CHAPTER 15. PUBLIC SAFETY.
20	ARTICLE 2. WEST VIRGINIA STATE POLICE.
21	§15-2-3. State Police structure; how established.
22	The superintendent shall create, appoint and equip the State
23	Police which shall consist of the number of troops, districts and
24	detachments required for the proper administration of the State
25	Police. Each troop, district or detachment shall be composed of
26	the number of officers and members the superintendent determines
27	are necessary to meet operational needs and are required for the
28	efficient operation of the State Police. The superintendent shall

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- 1 establish the general organizational structure of the State Police
  2 by interpretive rule in accordance with the provisions of article
  3 three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code. The superintendent
  4 shall provide adequate facilities for the training of all members

- 19 (a) It is unlawful for any employer to knowingly employ, hire, 20 recruit or refer, either for him or herself or on behalf of 21 another, for private or public employment within the state, an 22 unauthorized worker who is not duly authorized to be employed by 23 law.
- (b) Employers shall be required to verify a prospective
  25 employee's legal status or authorization to work prior to employing

- 2 (b) For purposes of this article, proof of legal status or 3 authorization to work includes, but is not limited to, a valid 4 social security card, a valid immigration or nonimmigration visa, 5 including photo identification, a valid birth certificate, a valid 6 passport, a valid photo identification card issued by a government 7 agency, a valid work permit or supervision permit authorized by the 8 Division of Labor, a valid permit issued by the Department of 9 Justice or other valid document providing evidence of legal 10 residence or authorization to work in the United States.
- (c) For purposes of enforcing the provisions of this article, and notwithstanding any other provision of this code to the contrary, the commissioner or his or her authorized representative may access information maintained by any other state agency, including, but not limited to, the Bureau of Employment Programs, Mest Virginia State Police, and the Division of Motor Vehicles, for the limited purpose of confirming the validity of a worker's legal status or authorization to work. The commissioner shall promulgate rules in accordance with the provisions of chapter twenty-nine-a of this code to safeguard against the release of any confidential or identifying information that is not necessary for the limited purpose of enforcing the provisions of this article.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to allow the Division of Labor and West Virginia State Police to confirm the validity of an employee's legal identification.
