10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$17C-6-7a$ of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended, relating to allowing the use of traffic law
12	photo-monitoring devices to detect or prove traffic law

14	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
15	That \$17C-6-7a of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
16	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
17	ARTICLE 6. SPEED RESTRICTIONS.
18	§17C-6-7a. Prohibition of the Use of traffic law photo-monitoring
19	devices to detect or prove traffic law violations.
20	(a) As used in this section "traffic law photo-monitoring
21	device" means an electronic system consisting of a photographic,
22	video, or electronic camera and a means of sensing the presence of
23	a motor vehicle that automatically produces photographs, videotape,

1 or digital images of the vehicle, its operator, or its license 2 plate.

- 3 (b) No police officer Members of the State Police, police
  4 officers of incorporated municipalities in classes one, two and
  5 three, as defined in chapter eight-a of this code, police officers
  6 of incorporated class four municipalities except upon controlled
  7 access or partially controlled access highways, and the sheriff
  8 and his or her deputies in the several counties may utilize a
  9 traffic law photo-monitoring device to determine compliance with,
  10 or to detect a violation of, a municipal or county ordinance or any
  11 provision of this code that governs or regulates the operation of
  12 motor vehicles.
- 13 (c) A violation of a municipal or county ordinance or any 14 provision of this code that governs or regulates the operation of 15 motor vehicles may <del>not</del> be proved by evidence obtained by the use of 16 a traffic law photo-monitoring device.
- (d) The provisions of this section do not prohibit the use of any device designed to measure and indicate the speed of a moving object by means of microwaves or reflected light to obtain evidence to prove the speed of a motor vehicle pursuant to section seven of this article.
- (e) The provisions of this section do not prohibit use of a traffic law photo-monitoring device for any other lawful purposes other than to obtain evidence to prove violations of municipal or

- 1 county ordinances or any provision of this code governing or
- 2 regulating the operation of motor vehicles.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to allow the use of traffic law photo-monitoring devices to detect or prove traffic law violations.
