10	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by
11	adding thereto a new section, designated §12-4-14a, relating
12	to creating a workers' compensation insurance subsidy program
13	for volunteer fire departments; establishing a special program
14	within the Auditor's Office; granting authority to the Auditor
15	to administer the program; designating a funding formula for
16	distribution of moneys allocated; defining terms; granting
17	rule-making authority to administer this section; and
18	requiring report to the Legislature.
19	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
20	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended
21	by adding thereto a new section, designated §12-4-14a, to read as
22	follows:
23	ARTICLE 4. ACCOUNTS, REPORTS AND GENERAL PROVISIONS.
24	<u>§12-4-14a. Workers' Compensation Subsidy for Volunteer Fire</u>

1	Departments; creation of program; Auditor to
2	administer.
3	(a) In recognition of the burden of increasing workers'
4	compensation insurance premiums on volunteer fire departments, the
5	Legislature has determined that additional funding assistance
6	should be made available to eligible departments to pay a portion
7	of those premium increases beginning with invoices due and payable
8	on or after July 1, 2011.
9	(b) There is hereby established a special program which shall
10	be known as the "Volunteer Fire Department Workers' Compensation
11	Subsidy Program." The program shall be administered by the State
12	Auditor from moneys that may be appropriated and designated for the
13	program by the Legislature.
14	(c) The State Auditor shall administer the distribution of
15	moneys appropriated for Volunteer Fire Department Workers'
16	Compensation Subsidy Program to volunteer fire departments to help
17	defray workers' compensation insurance premium increases.
18	(1) Volunteer fire departments shall request supplemental funds
19	by submitting to the Auditor the following information:
20	(A) The previous fiscal year's workers' compensation premium
21	invoices with paid receipts;
22	(B) The current fiscal year's workers' compensation premium
23	invoices showing the amount due and due date and any applicable
24	paid receipts; and

1 <u>(C) Any other information the Auditor may deem necessary for</u> 2 <u>administering the subsidy on such forms and schedules as the</u> 3 <u>Auditor may direct. The Auditor is authorized to set up an</u> 4 <u>electronic filing system at the discretion of the Auditor for</u> 5 <u>filing of the aforementioned information.</u>

6 (D) For purposes of this section, "fiscal year" means the 7 fiscal year of this state.

8 (2) After determining that there is a premium increase and the 9 amount of the premium increase for the volunteer fire department 10 requesting the subsidy, the Auditor shall make disbursements in the 11 manner set forth in subsection (d) of this section subject to the 12 following requirements:

13 (A) The volunteer fire department must be in good standing with 14 the State Fire Marshal;

15 <u>(B) The volunteer fire department must be registered with the</u> 16 <u>Auditor's Office in a form and manner prescribed by the Auditor</u> 17 <u>prior to being eligible for consideration of any subsidy, which</u> 18 <u>registration must be completed no fewer than thirty days prior to</u> 19 <u>the due date of the workers' compensation premium;</u>

20 <u>(C) The volunteer fire department must agree that the subsidy</u> 21 <u>for its workers' compensation insurance premium increase will be</u> 22 <u>paid directly to its insurance carrier by the Auditor and that it</u> 23 <u>will timely pay the balance of the premium due;</u>

24 (d) Beginning with the fiscal year that starts July 1, 2011,

1 and continuing in each fiscal year thereafter, after the Auditor 2 has verified that a volunteer fire department is eligible for a 3 subsidy pursuant to this section, he or she shall pay on behalf of 4 a volunteer fire department its subsidy, which is calculated by: 5 (1) Dividing the total amount of premium subsidy allocated by 6 the Legislature to the Volunteer Fire Department Workers' 7 Compensation Subsidy Program by the total premium minus the total 8 base year premium, which calculation produces the "total shortfall 9 multiplier"; and 10 (2) Multiplying the total shortfall multiplier determined in 11 subdivision (1) of this subsection by the individual premium less 12 the individual base year premium. 13 (3) In no event shall a volunteer fire department receive a 14 workers' compensation premium subsidy greater than one hundred 15 percent of its premium increase. 16 (e) For fiscal years after the fiscal year beginning on July 17 1, 2011, the Auditor shall consult with the Insurance Commissioner 18 to determine the total amount of workers' compensation premium due 19 by volunteer fire departments for any subsequent fiscal year. The 20 Auditor may determine payment dates based upon information 21 reasonably available for such a determination. 22 (f) For the purposes of this section: (1) "Individual base year premium" means the workers' 23

24 compensation insurance premium that became due and payable by a

1 volunteer fire department after June 30, 2010 but before July 1,
2 2011.

3 <u>(2) "Individual premium" means the workers' compensation</u> 4 premium due and payable by a volunteer fire department in each 5 twelve month period beginning on or after July 1, 2011.

6 <u>(3) "Total base year premium" means the aggregate workers'</u> 7 <u>compensation insurance premium due and payable by all volunteer</u> 8 <u>fire departments as determined by the Insurance Commissioner after</u> 9 June 30, 2010 but before July 1, 2011.

10 <u>(4) "Total premium" means the aggregate workers' compensation</u>
11 <u>insurance premium due and payable by all volunteer fire departments</u>
12 in each twelve month period beginning on or after July 1, 2011.

13 (g) The Auditor may promulgate emergency rules and may propose 14 for promulgation legislative rules, in accordance with the 15 provisions of article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code, as 16 are necessary to provide for implementation and enforcement of the 17 provisions of this section.

18 (h) The volunteer fire departments' workers' compensation 19 premium subsidy program shall undergo a review to assess its 20 effectiveness after three years of operation. The Auditor shall 21 submit a report to the Legislature not later than February 1, 2015, 22 and provide details of the program operation including funds 23 distributed and departments taking advantage of the subsidy.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide a program for

distribution of a workers' compensation insurance premium subsidy to volunteer fire departments meeting the requirements for participation.
