14	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
15	That $3-1-8$ of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be
16	amended and reenacted to read as follows:
17	ARTICLE 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS AND DEFINITIONS.
18	§3-1-8. Political party defined; parties or groups that may
19	participate in municipal primary elections.
20	Any affiliation of voters representing any principle or
21	organization which, at the last preceding regular general election,
22	polled for its candidate for Governor, <u>Secretary of State</u> ,
23	Treasurer, Auditor, Attorney General, Supreme Court of Appeals,
24	Commissioner of Agriculture, or any other office on the ballot to
25	be voted upon by all voters state-wide in that election, at least
26	one per cent of the total number of votes cast for all candidates

1 for that office in the state <u>any one of those aforementioned state</u> 2 <u>public offices</u>, shall be a political party, within the meaning and 3 for the purpose of this chapter: *Provided*, That notwithstanding 4 the foregoing provisions of this section, the governing body of any 5 municipality may, by ordinance adopted by the affirmative vote of 6 at least three fourths of the members of such governing body by 7 recorded vote, provide that municipal political parties or groups 8 within such municipality that do not meet the requirements of this 9 section for classification as a political party may participate in 10 the primary elections of any such municipality. Any such ordinance 11 shall contain provisions implementing the foregoing proviso, which 12 implementing provisions shall conform as nearly as practicable to 13 any general provisions of law relating to municipal primary 14 elections.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to allow political parties to obtain ballot access by expanding the scope of the definition of political party.
