10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$22-20-1$ of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended, relating to the Department of Environmental
12	Protection; creating independent Office of Environmental
13	Advocate; appointment of Director of the Office of
14	Environmental Advocate; and providing for salary, staff,
15	powers, duties and rules.
16	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
17	That §22-20-1 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
18	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
19	ARTICLE 20. ENVIRONMENTAL ADVOCATE.
20	<pre>§22-20-1. Creation of Office of Environmental Advocate;</pre>
21	Appointment of Director of Office of Environmental
22	Advocate; powers and duties; staff; salary.
23	The director of the Division of Environmental Protection shall
24	appoint a person to serve as the environmental advocate within the
25	Division of Environmental Protection, and shall adopt and

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1 promulgate rules in accordance with the provisions of article
2 three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code governing and controlling
3 the qualifications, powers and duties of the person to be appointed
4 to the position of environmental advocate. The environmental
5 advocate shall serve at the will and pleasure of the director, who
6 shall also set the salary of the environmental advocate. All
7 funding for the office of environmental advocate shall be from
8 existing funds of the Division of Environmental Protection. The
9 director shall provide an office and secretarial and support staff
10 as needed.

(a) There is hereby created within the Department of Environmental Protection the Office of Environmental Advocate. The Secretary of the Department of Environmental Protection shall appoint a Director of the Office of Environmental Advocate, from a list of three qualified candidates provided by the West Virginia Environmental Council, to serve for a term of four years, effective July 1, 2011. The director shall be eligible for reappointment. The director shall be a citizen and a resident of this state and an attorney admitted to practice in this state, with a minimum of five years active practice of law. The director shall be paid a salary within the range applicable to the general counsel of the department. The director shall be responsible for the administration of the Office of Environmental Advocate, including the provision of adequate technical and professional staff,

1 including two other attorneys, offices, equipment and other 2 facilities so as to ensure the departmental and financial 3 independence of the Office of Environmental Advocate from the 4 Department of Environmental Protection. 5 (b) The Office of Environmental Advocate may intervene as a 6 party on behalf of West Virginia citizens or their organizations 7 who may be directly impacted by any mining permit granted and or 8 being considered by the West Virginia Department of Environmental 9 Protection. The Office of the Environmental Advocate is further 10 authorized and directed to: 11 (1) Evaluate all matters pending before the Department of 12 Environmental Protection to determine if the interests of West 13 Virginia citizens are affected; 14 (2) Petition the Department of Environmental protection, its 15 commissions or boards to initiate proceedings to protect the 16 interest of West Virginia citizens; 17 (3) Appear before the Department of Environmental Protection, 18 its commissions or boards as a party on behalf of West Virginia 19 citizens or its organizations in such cases as the advocate 20 determines that the citizens may be directly and negatively 21 impacted by a mining, oil and gas drilling permit or other 22 environmental impact permit; and (4) Appeal any determination, finding or order of the 23 24 Department of Environmental Protection determined by the

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1 Environmental Advocate to be adverse to the West Virginia citizens
2 by whatever legal means or strategy the Environmental Advocate may
3 determine.

4 (c) The Director of the Office of Environmental Advocate 5 shall, within the limits of the funds available to that office, 6 employ such legal, professional, technical, secretarial and 7 clerical personnel as are necessary to carry out the 8 responsibilities of that office. The salaries paid to the members 9 of the staff of the Office of Environmental Advocate shall be 10 consistent with and in the range applicable to salaries paid to 11 employees of the Department of Environmental Protection. Offices 12 for the Environmental Advocate shall be located separately from the 13 offices of the Department of Environmental Protection and may not 14 be associated with or connected to the other divisions of the 15 Department of Environmental Protection. The Department of 16 Environmental Protection shall provide funding for Offices for the 17 Environmental Advocate.

18 (d) The Director of the Office of Environmental Advocate may 19 be removed only for cause by The Secretary of the Department of 20 Environmental Protection for official misconduct, incompetence, 21 neglect or duty or gross immorality. No other provision of this 22 code purporting to limit the term of office of any appointed 23 official or employee or affecting the removal of any appointed 24 official or employee is applicable to the Director of the Office of

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1 Environmental Advocate.

(e) The Secretary of the Department of Environmental Protection shall propose rules for legislative approval in accordance with the provisions of article three, chapter twentyinine-a of this code governing and controlling the qualifications, powers and duties of the person to be appointed to the position of Environmental Advocate.
(f) The current Environmental Advocate and staff shall be remain in place until July 1, 2011 and may be incorporated into the office created by this section. With the exception of the selection and dismissal of the advocate and the funding of the office, The Department of Environmental Protection will have no continuing supervisory authority over the Office of Environmental Advocate.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to create the Office of Environmental Advocate with an appointment of Director of the Office of Environmental Advocate, independent of the Division of Environmental Protection. The bill also provides for salary, staff, powers, duties and rules.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from the present law, and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
