

1 . **HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 113**

6 Requesting the Division of Highways to name the over 8 mile stretch
7 of Route 3, from Foster, West Virginia to its connection with
8 Corridor G, the "PFC Darrell Lee Cabell Memorial Highway."

9 WHEREAS, Darrell Cabell was born November 2, 1947 in Foster,
10 West Virginia; and

11 WHEREAS, Darrell Cabell was a brave member of the United States
12 Army, C Company, of the 1st Battalion, 14th Infantry, 4th Infantry
13 Division; and

14 WHEREAS, Darrell Cabell started his tour of duty in South
15 Vietnam on November 18, 1967; and

16 WHEREAS, Darrell Cabell was serving in the Quang Nam Province
17 in South Vietnam when the helicopter he was in came under enemy
18 fire; and

19 WHEREAS, Darrell Cabell died on February 18, 1968 after his
20 helicopter was hit with enemy fire and crashed in South Vietnam;
21 and

22 WHEREAS, His name can now be found on Panel 40E Line 002 with
23 thousands of other brave soldiers; therefore, be it

24 *Resolved by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

25 That the Legislature hereby requests the Commissioner of the

1 Division of Highways to name the over 8 mile stretch of Route 3,
2 from Foster, West Virginia to its connection with Corridor G, the
3 "PFC Darrell Lee Cabell Memorial Highway;" and, be it

4 *Further Resolved,* That the Commissioner of the Division of
5 Highways is hereby requested to cause to be fabricated signs to be
6 erected at both ends of the 8 mile stretch of Route 3, containing
7 bold and prominent letters proclaiming the bridge to be the "PFC
8 Darrell Lee Cabell Memorial Highway;" and, be it

9 *Further Resolved,* That the Clerk of the House of Delegates
10 forward a certified copy of this resolution to the Secretary of
11 Transportation, the Commissioner of the Division of Highways, and
12 the surviving family of Darrell Lee Cabell.
