6 Requesting the Division of Highways to name the bridge located in

7       Greenbrier County, West Virginia, that spans the Muddy Creek

8       River on Route 3, Bridge No. 13-3-0.41, the "Campbell Memorial

9       Bridge."

10       WHEREAS, James William "Bill" Campbell was born on February 5,

11 1930 at the Campbell home place on Teaberry Road in Ronceverte,

12 West Virginia. He served in the Korean War as a Corporal from

13 October 18, 1951, to September 30, 1953, and remained in reserve

14 duty after the Korean War showing his dedication to his country;

16       WHEREAS, James William "Bill" Campbell was a life long member

17 of the VFW, served the City of Hinton from 1963 to 1970, including

18 a period from 1964-1966 in which he served as Chief of Police. He

19 served the Greenbrier Hotel from 1970 to 1993 as a Security Guard

20 and from 1990 to 1994, Bill Campbell was Vice-Chairman of the

21 Greenbrier County Democrat Committee; and

22       WHEREAS, Corporal James William "Bill" Campbell passed away on

23 November 16, 2010, and his service and commitment to his country

24 and community should not go unnoticed and it is a fitting

1 remembrance and tribute to name a bridge in his honor; therefore,  
2 be it

3       Resolved by the Legislature of West Virginia:

4       That the Division of Highways is hereby requested to name the  
5 bridge located in Greenbrier County, West Virginia, that spans the  
6 Muddy Creek River on Route 3, Bridge No. 13-3-0.41, the "Campbell  
7 Memorial Bridge"; and, be it

8       Further Resolved, That the Division of Highways is requested  
9 to have made and be placed, signs identifying the bridge as the  
10 "Campbell Memorial Bridge"; and, be it

11       Further Resolved, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates  
12 forward a certified copy of this resolution to the surviving  
13 Campbell family members and the Secretary of the Department of  
14 Transportation.
