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10 A BILL to amend and reenact article 9, chapter 64 of the Code of
11 West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to authorizing the
12 Board of Pharmacy to promulgate a legislative rule relating to
13 controlled substances monitoring.

14 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

15 That article 9, chapter 64 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931,
16 as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

17 **ARTICLE 9. AUTHORIZATION FOR MISCELLANEOUS AGENCIES AND BOARDS TO**
18 **PROMULGATE LEGISLATIVE RULES.**

19 **§64-9-1. Board of Pharmacy.**

20 The legislative rule filed in the state register on the
21 twenty-ninth day of July, two thousand ten, authorized under the
22 authority of section five, article nine, chapter sixty-a, of this
23 code, relating to the Board of Pharmacy (controlled substances
24 monitoring, 15 CSR 8), is authorized.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize the Board of Pharmacy to promulgate a legislative rule relating to Controlled Substances Monitoring.

This section is new; therefore, strike-throughs and underscoring have been omitted.
