

1 (1) That on ~~July 1, 2011~~ January 1, 2012, every prescription
2 written in West Virginia by a practitioner shall be written on
3 official West Virginia tamper-resistant prescription paper.

4 (2) Contracting requirements for contracting with a program
5 vendor or vendors including auditing requirements for printing
6 facilities and standard prescription pad formatting requirements.

7 (3) Standard format for prescription paper and the development
8 of identifying markers on prescription paper. These markers shall
9 be on the front and back of the prescription paper to be used by
10 practitioners throughout the state.

11 (4) A means of reporting unauthorized use, theft or
12 destruction of authorized state prescription paper.

13 (5) Fees for the distribution of standard format prescription
14 paper to practitioners and facilities.
