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10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$3-6-4a$ of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended, relating to elections; requiring write-in
12	candidates for public office to pay a filing fee for the
13	office sought; and providing for distribution of the fee in
14	the same manner as other candidates.
15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That §3-6-4a of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
17	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
18	ARTICLE 6. CONDUCT AND ADMINISTRATION OF ELECTIONS.
19	§3-6-4a. Filing requirements for write-in candidates.
20	Any eligible person who seeks to be elected by write-in votes
21	to an office, except delegate to national convention, which is to
22	be filled in a primary, general or special election held under the
23	provisions of this chapter, shall file a write-in candidate's

1 certificate of announcement as provided in this section. No 2 certificate of announcement may be accepted and no person may be 3 certified as a write-in candidate for a political party nomination 4 for any office or for election as delegate to national convention.

5 (a) The write-in candidate's certificate of announcement shall 6 be in a form prescribed by the Secretary of State on which the 7 candidate shall make a sworn statement before a notary public or 8 other officer authorized to give oaths containing the following 9 information:

10 (1) The name of the office sought and the district and 11 division, if any;

12 (2) The legal name of the candidate and the first and last 13 name by which the candidate may be identified in seeking the 14 office;

(3) The specific address designating the location at which the candidate resides at the time of filing, including number and resides at the time of filing, including number and resides at the time of filing, including number and resides at the time of filing, including number and resides at the time of filing, including number and (4) A statement that the person filing the certificate of announcement is a candidate for the office in good faith; and (5) The words "subscribed and sworn to before me this _____

21 day of _____, ___" and a space for the signature of the 22 officer giving the oath; <u>and</u>

23 (6) A filing fee equal to twenty-five percent of the amount
24 required by the provisions of section eight, article five of this

<u>chapter for the particular office sought by the write-in candidate.</u>
 <u>All fees collected from write-in candidates shall be distributed in</u>
 <u>the same manner as provided by the provisions of section eight</u>,
 <u>article five of this chapter</u>.

5 (b) The certificate of announcement shall be filed with the 6 filing officer for the political division of the office as 7 prescribed in section seven, article five of this chapter.

8 © The certificate of announcement shall be filed with and 9 received by the proper filing officer as follows:

10 (1) Except as provided in subdivisions (2) and (3) of this 11 subsection, the certificate of announcement for any office shall be 12 received no later than the close of business on the forty-second 13 day before the election at which the office is to be filled;

(2) When a vacancy occurs in the nomination of candidates for 15 an office on the ballot resulting from the death of the nominee or 16 from the disqualification or removal of a nominee from the ballot 17 by a court of competent jurisdiction not earlier than the twenty-18 first day nor later than the fifth day before the general election, 19 the certificate shall be received no later than the close of 20 business on the fifth day before the election or the close of 21 business on the day following the occurrence of the vacancy, 22 whichever is later;

(3) When a vacancy occurs in an elective office which would24 not otherwise appear on the ballot in the election, but which

1 creates an unexpired term of one or more years which, according to 2 the provisions of this chapter, is to be filled by election in the 3 next ensuing election and the vacancy occurs no earlier than the 4 twenty-first day and no later than the fifth day before the general 5 election, the certificate shall be received no later than the close 6 of business on the fifth day before the election or the close of 7 business on the day following the occurrence of the vacancy, 8 whichever is later.

9 (d) Any eligible person who files a completed write-in 10 candidate's certificate of announcement with the proper filing 11 officer within the required time shall be certified by that filing 12 officer as an official write-in candidate:

(1) The Secretary of State shall, immediately following the filing deadline, post the names of all official write-in candidates for offices on the ballot in more than one county and certify the name of each official write-in candidate to the clerks of the rounty commissions of the appropriate counties.

18 (2) The clerk of the county commission shall, immediately 19 following the filing deadline, post the names of all official 20 write-in candidates for offices on the ballot in one county and 21 certify and deliver to the election officials of the appropriate 22 precincts, the names of all official write-in candidates and the 23 office sought by each for statewide, district and county offices on 24 the ballot in the precinct for which valid write-in votes will be

1 counted and the names shall be posted at the office where absentee

2 voting is conducted and at the precincts in accordance with section

3 twenty, article one of this chapter.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require write-in candidates for public office to pay a filing fee for the office sought and to provide for distribution of the fee in the same manner as other candidates.
