A group or blanket accident of health insurance policy or issuing a group or blanket policy for delivery in this state which provides coverage for hospital, surgical, or medical care coverage shall include full coverage for the prevention, early detection, diagnosis and treatment of autism spectrum disorder, regardless of whether such prevention, early detection, diagnosis or treatment methods are research based or experimental. Each policy shall also provide full (in-state or in-network) coverage for the prevention,

- 11 A medical expense indemnity corporation, a hospital service 12 corporation or a health service corporation which provides coverage 13 for hospital, surgical, or medical care coverage shall include full 14 coverage for the prevention, early detection, diagnosis and 15 treatment of autism spectrum disorder, regardless of whether such 16 prevention, early detection, diagnosis or treatment methods are 17 research based or experimental. Each corporation shall also 18 provide full (in-state or in-network) coverage for the prevention, 19 early detection, diagnosis and treatment of autism spectrum 20 disorder even if the individual is unable to receive a service, or 21 treatment, within the State of West Virginia and must receive this 22 service, or treatment, from an out-of-state provider. For purposes 23 of this section, "autism spectrum disorder" means a neurobiological 24 condition that includes Autism, ADD, ADHD, Asperger syndrome, 25 Rett's syndrome, or pervasive developmental disorder.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require health insurers to provide full coverage for the prevention, early detection, diagnosis and treatment of autism spectrum disorder.
