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- 13 Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
- 14 That \$20-2-4 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
- 15 be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
- 16 ARTICLE 2. WILDLIFE RESOURCES.
- 17 §20-2-4. Possession of wildlife.
- 18 Except for wildlife, lawfully taken, killed or obtained, no
- 19 person shall may have in his or her possession any wildlife, or
- 20 parts thereof, during closed seasons. It is unlawful to possess
- 21 any wildlife, or parts thereof, which have been illegally taken,
- 22 killed or obtained. Any wildlife illegally taken, killed or
- 23 possessed shall be forfeited to the state and shall be counted
- 24 toward the daily, seasonal, bag, creel and possession limit of the
- 25 person in possession of, or responsible for, the illegal taking or
- 26 killing of any wildlife.
- 27 Wildlife lawfully taken outside of this state shall be is

- 1 subject to the same laws and rules as that taken within this state.
- 2 Migratory wild birds shall may be possessed only in accordance
- 3 with the "Migratory Bird Treaty Act" and regulations thereunder.
- 4 The restrictions in this section do not apply to the director
- 5 or duly authorized agents, who may, in any manner, take or maintain
- 6 in captivity, at any time, any wildlife for the purpose of carrying
- 7 out the provisions of this chapter.
- 8 Wildlife, except protected birds, spotted fawn, and bear cubs,
- 9 killed or mortally wounded as a result of being accidentally or
- 10 inadvertently struck by a motor vehicle may be lawfully possessed
- 11 Provided, That if the possessor of such the wildlife shall provide
- 12 provides notice of the claim within twelve hours to a relevant law-
- 13 enforcement agency, and obtain obtains a nonhunting game tag within
- 14 twenty-four hours of possession. The director shall propose
- 15 administrative policy which shall address addresses the means,
- 16 methods and administrative procedures for implementing the
- 17 provisions of this section.
- Persons required to deliver wildlife to an official checking
- 19 station may, in accordance with rules promulgated by the director,
- 20 electronically register the wildlife in lieu of the delivery to an
- 21 official checking station. "Electronically register" means
- 22 submission of all necessary and relevant information to the
- 23 division, in the manner designated by rule, in lieu of delivery of
- 24 the wildlife to an official checking station. The director may
- 25 promulgate rules, pursuant to article three, chapter twenty-nine-a
- 26 of this code, governing the electronic registration of wildlife.
