15	reviews and audits; and providing for revocation of degree-
16	granting authority under certain conditions.
17	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
18	That §18B-4-7 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
19	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
20	ARTICLE 4. GENERAL ADMINISTRATION.
21	§18B-4-7. Accreditation of institutions of higher education;
22	standards for degrees.
23	(a) The council shall make rules for the accreditation of
24	community and technical colleges in this state and shall determine

1 the minimum standards for conferring degrees. The commission shall 2 make rules for the accreditation of colleges and universities in 3 this state except the governing boards of Marshall University and 4 West Virginia University shall make rules for the state 5 institutions of higher education known as Marshall University and 6 West Virginia University, and shall determine the minimum standards 7 for conferring degrees. The governing boards of Marshall 8 University and West Virginia University shall promulgate rules 9 pursuant to the provisions of section six, article one of this 10 chapter for the accreditation of the state institutions of higher 11 education known as Marshall University and West Virginia 12 University.

13 (b) An institution of higher education may not confer any a 14 degree on any basis of work or merit below the minimum standards 15 prescribed by the council or commission. or the governing boards. 16 Nothing in this section infringes upon the rights, including rights 17 to award degrees, granted to any institution by charter given 18 according to law, or by actions of the Council or Commission or 19 their predecessors, prior to the effective date of this section. 20 (c) With the approval of the commission and subject to 21 subsections (e), (f) and (g) of this section, governing boards of 22 institutions which currently offer substantial undergraduate course 23 offerings and a master's degree in a discipline are authorized to 24 grant baccalaureate degrees in that discipline.

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1 <u>(d)</u> Except as otherwise provided in this section, a charter or 2 other instrument containing the right to confer degrees of higher 3 education status may not be granted by the State of West Virginia 4 to <u>any an</u> institution, association or organization within the 5 state, nor may <u>any such a</u> degree be awarded, until the condition of 6 conferring the degree <u>first</u> has <del>first</del> been approved in writing by 7 the council <u>or</u> commission, <del>or</del> <u>appropriate</u> <u>governing</u> <u>board</u> <u>as</u> 8 appropriate.

9 <u>(e) To retain the authority to confer degrees pursuant to this</u> 10 <u>section, each institution shall provide annually to the commission</u> 11 <u>or council, as requested, all information the commission or council</u> 12 <u>considers necessary to assess the performance of the institution</u> 13 <u>and to determine whether the institution continues to meet the</u> 14 <u>minimum standards for conferring degrees.</u> This information 15 <u>includes, but is not limited to, the following data:</u>

16 (1) All information current and future federal or state laws
17 and regulations require the institution to report to the public, to
18 students, to employees or to federal or state agencies;

19 <u>(2) Other consumer information the commission or council</u> 20 <u>considers necessary, including, but not limited to, graduation and</u> 21 <u>retention rates, transfers, post-graduation placements, loan</u> 22 <u>defaults and numbers and types of student complaints;</u>

23 (3) A detailed explanation of financial operations including,
24 but not limited to, policies, formulas and procedures related to

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1 calculation, payment and refund for all tuition and fees; and

2 <u>(4) An assessment of the adequacy of the institution's</u> 3 <u>curriculum, personnel, facilities, materials and equipment to meet</u> 4 the minimum standards for conferring degrees.

5 <u>(f) The commission and council may conduct on-site reviews to</u> 6 <u>evaluate an institution's academic standards, may conduct financial</u> 7 <u>audits, or may require the institution to perform these audits and</u> 8 provide detailed data to the commission or council.

9 (g) The commission or council shall revoke an institution's 10 authority to confer degrees when the governing body and/or chief 11 executive officer of the institution has failed to maintain the 12 minimum standards for conferring degrees or has refused or 13 willfully failed to provide information to the commission or 14 council pursuant to this subsection in a manner and within a 15 reasonable time frame as established by the commission or council, 16 as appropriate.

<sup>(</sup>NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize the Policy Commission and the Council to collect and disseminate information they consider necessary to aid consumers in assessing the performance of institutions of higher education in the state and to require the Policy Commission or Council to revoke an institution's authority to confer degrees under certain conditions.
