16	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

20	§60A-10-7. Restricted products; rule-making authority.
21	(a) On or before July 1, 2005, The Board of Pharmacy shall
22	promulgate emergency and legislative rules pursuant to the
23	provision of article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code to

24 implement a program wherein the Board of Pharmacy shall consult

1 consults with the Superintendent of the State Police in identifying 2 drug products which are a designated precursor, in addition to 3 those that contain as their single an active ingredient ephedrine, 4 pseudoephedrine or phenylpropanolamine, that are commonly being 5 used in the production and distribution of methamphetamine. Those 6 drug products which the superintendent of the State Police have 7 demonstrated by empirical evidence are commonly used in the 8 manufacture of methamphetamine shall be added to a supplemental 9 list and shall be are subject to all of the restrictions of this These The rules established pursuant to this section 10 article. 11 shall include (1) a process whereby pharmacies are made aware of 12 all drug products that contain as their single an active ingredient 13 ephedrine, pseudoephedrine and phenylpropanolamine that will be 14 listed as a Schedule ₹ III substance. and must be sold, transferred 15 or dispensed from behind a pharmacy counter; 16 (2) A process whereby pharmacies and retail establishments are 17 made aware of additional drug products added to Schedule V that are 18 required to be placed behind the pharmacy counter for sale, 19 transfer or distribution can be periodically reviewed and updated. 20 (b) At any time after July 1, 2005, the Board of Pharmacy, 21 upon the recommendation of the superintendent of the State Police, 22 shall promulgate emergency and legislative rules pursuant to the 23 provision of article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code to 24 implement an updated supplemental list of products containing the 25 controlled substances ephedrine, pseudoephedrine

- 1 phenylpropanolamine as an active ingredient or any other drug used
- 2 as a precursor in the manufacture of methamphetamine, which the
- 3 superintendent of the State Police has demonstrated by empirical
- 4 evidence is being used in the manufacture of methamphetamine. This
- 5 listing process shall comport with the requirements of subsection
- 6 (a) of this section.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to add language to West Virginia Code §60A-10-7 requiring the issuance of a lawful prescription for dispensing drug products containing as an active ingredient ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, phenylpropanolamine and other chemical precursors of methamphetamine.
