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11	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by
12	adding thereto a new article, designated §5B-2H-1, §5B-2H-2,
13	S5B-2H-3 and $S5B-2H-4$, all relating to creating the Keep Jobs
14	in West Virginia Act; requiring all work performed for the
15	state by contractors be performed in the United States; making
16	legislative findings; permitting the state to seek damages and
17	void contracts for work done outside the country; and
18	providing exceptions.
19	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
20	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended
21	by adding thereto a new article, designated §5B-2H-1, §5B-2H-2,
22	<pre>§5B-2H-3 and §5B-2H-4, all to read as follows:</pre>
23	ARTICLE 5B. KEEP JOBS IN WEST VIRGINIA ACT.
24	§5B-2H-1. Title.

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1 This article may be known as the "Keep Jobs in West Virginia 2 Act."

3 §5B-2H-2. Legislative findings.

4 The Legislature finds that:

5 (1) State departments and agencies procure services through6 contracts with private vendors.

7 (2) Increasingly, private vendors purchase or carry out these 8 services, or subcontract or otherwise procure these services, from 9 a location outside the United States. This international 10 outsourcing substantially increases unemployment and workforce 11 dislocation and deprives West Virginia residents of job 12 opportunities, including industries and jobs that West Virginia has 13 expended resources to attract.

14 (3) International outsourcing erodes state and local revenues 15 by drawing jobs and income away from state residents and 16 businesses. International outsourcing additionally may provide 17 fewer privacy protections for state residents whose personal 18 information may, in the course of service delivery, be transmitted 19 to locations outside the United States.

20 §5B-2H-3. State contracts.

21 Except as provided in section four of this article, the 22 following requirements apply to all state contracts:

(1) State department and agencies may not award a contract to 24 a contractor or subcontractor who performs the work at a site 25 outside the United States;

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1 (2) Each vendor submitting a bid or contract to provide 2 services for the state must certify the services covered by the bid 3 or contract will be performed in the United States;

4 (3) If, during the life of the contract, the contractor or 5 subcontractor shifts work overseas, then the department or agency 6 shall require the contractor or subcontractor to pay damages in an 7 amount equal to the amount paid by the department or agency for the 8 percentage of outsourced work. The department or agency also shall 9 terminate the contract for noncompliance; and

10 (4) The department or agency is entitled to bring a civil 11 action in state or federal court to compel enforcement or damages 12 under this article. The court shall award reasonable attorney's 13 fees and costs to the department or agency.

14 §5B-2H-4. Exceptions.

15 Section three of this article does not apply to a contract if 16 refusing to award that contract would violate the specific terms to 17 which state consented under:

18 (1) The Agreement on Government Procurement of the World Trade19 Organization; or

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) (2) A bilateral or regional free trade agreement.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to create the "Keep Jobs in West Virginia Act." The bill requires all work performed for the state by contractors be performed in the United States. The bill makes legislative findings. The bill also permits the state to seek damages and void contracts for work done outside the country and provides exceptions.
