12	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$16-38-3$ of the Code of West Virginia,
13	1931, as amended, relating to prohibiting minors under the age
14	of sixteen from obtaining a tattoo; and requiring a parent or
15	guardian's written consent for minors over the age of sixteen.
16	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
17	That §16-38-3 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
18	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
19	ARTICLE 38. TATTOO STUDIO BUSINESS.
20	§16-38-3. Operation standards.
21	(a) Records
22	(1) Proper records of tattoos administered shall be maintained
23	for each patron by the holder of the studio registration;
24	(2) A record shall be prepared for each patron prior to any

- 1 procedure being performed and shall include the patron's name and
- 2 signature, address, age, date tattooed, design of the tattoo,
- 3 location of the tattoo on the patron's body and the name of the
- 4 tattoo artist who performed the work;
- 5 (3) Record entries shall be in ink or indelible pencil and
- 6 shall be available for examination by the inspecting authorities
- 7 provided in section six of this article;
- 8 (4) Before tattoo administration, the owner or tattoo artist
- 9 shall discuss with the patron the risks involved in the tattoo
- 10 requested, including the potential that a tattoo may interfere with
- 11 the clinical reading of a magnetic resonance imaging study should
- 12 the patron intending to be tattooed ever encounter a medical need
- 13 for such a study. The owner shall provide the patron with written
- 14 information regarding the possible complications that may arise
- 15 from receiving a tattoo. The written information shall be prepared
- 16 by the Department of Health and Human Resources. Receipt of the
- 17 information shall be acknowledged in writing by the patron. The
- 18 owner or tattoo artist shall also keep and maintain the
- 19 acknowledgment as part of the patron's record pursuant to the
- 20 provisions of subdivision (5) of this subsection.
- 21 (5) All records required by this section shall be kept on file
- 22 for five years by the holder of the studio registration for the
- 23 studio in which the tattoo was performed.
- 24 (b) Consent. --

- 1 (1) No person under the age of sixteen may be tattooed. Prior
- 2 written consent for tattooing of minors above the age of sixteen
- 3 shall be obtained from one parent or quardian;
- 4 (2) All written consents shall be kept on file for five years
- 5 by the holder of the studio registration for the tattoo studio in
- 6 which the tattoo was performed;
- 7 (3) The person receiving the tattoo shall attest to the fact
- 8 that he or she is not intoxicated or under the influence of drugs
- 9 or alcohol.
- 10 (c) Tattooing procedures. --
- 11 (1) Printed instructions on the care of the skin after
- 12 tattooing shall be given to each patron as a precaution to prevent
- 13 infection:
- 14 (2) A copy of the printed instructions shall be posted in a
- 15 conspicuous place, clearly visible to the person being tattooed;
- 16 (3) Each tattoo artist shall wear a clean outer garment, i.e.,
- 17 apron, smock, T-shirt, etc.;
- 18 (4) Tattoo artists who are experiencing diarrhea, vomiting,
- 19 fever, rash, productive cough, jaundice, draining or open skin
- 20 infections such as boils which could be indicative of more serious
- 21 conditions such as, but not limited to, impetigo, scabies,
- 22 hepatitis-b, HIV or AIDS shall refrain from tattooing activities
- 23 until such time as they are no longer experiencing or exhibiting
- 24 the aforementioned symptoms;

- 1 (5) Before working on each patron, the fingernails and hands
- 2 of the tattoo artist shall be thoroughly washed and scrubbed with
- 3 hot running water, antibacterial soap and an individual hand brush
- 4 that is clean and in good repair;
- 5 (6) The tattoo artist's hands shall be air blown dried or
- 6 dried by a single-use towel. In addition, disposable latex
- 7 examination gloves shall be worn during the tattoo process. The
- 8 gloves shall be changed each time there is an interruption in the
- 9 tattoo application, the gloves become torn or punctured or whenever
- 10 their ability to function as a barrier is compromised;
- 11 (7) Only sterilized or single-use, disposable razors shall be
- 12 used to shave the area to be tattooed;
- 13 (8) Immediately prior to beginning the tattoo procedure, the
- 14 affected skin area shall be treated with an antibacterial solution;
- 15 (9) If an acetate stencil is used by a tattoo artist for
- 16 transferring the design to the skin, the acetate stencil shall be
- 17 thoroughly cleaned and rinsed in a germicidal solution for at least
- 18 twenty minutes and then dried with sterile gauze or dried in the
- 19 air on a sanitized surface after each use;
- 20 (10) If a paper stencil is used by a tattoo artist for
- 21 transferring the design to the skin, the paper stencil shall be
- 22 single-use and disposable;
- 23 (11) If the design is drawn directly onto the skin, the design
- 24 shall be applied with a single-use article only.

- 1 (d) Dyes or pigments. --
- 2 (1) Only nontoxic sterile dyes or pigments shall be used and
- 3 shall be prepared in sterilized or disposable single-use containers
- 4 for each patron;
- 5 (2) After tattooing, the unused dye or pigment in the single-6 use containers shall be discarded along with the container;
- 7 (3) All dyes or pigments used in tattooing shall be from
- 8 professional suppliers specifically providing dyes or pigments for
- 9 the tattooing of human skin.
- 10 (e) Sterilization of needles. --
- 11 (1) A set of individual, sterilized needles shall be used for 12 each patron;
- 13 (2) No less than twenty-four sets of sterilized needles and
- 14 tubes shall be on hand for the entire day or night operation.
- 15 Unused sterilized instruments shall be resterilized at intervals of
- 16 no more than six months from the date of the last sterilization;
- 17 (3) Used, nondisposable instruments shall be kept in a
- 18 separate, puncture resistant container until brush scrubbed in hot
- 19 water and soap and then sterilized by autoclaving;
- 20 (4) If used instruments are ultrasonically cleaned prior to
- 21 being placed in the used instrument container, they shall be
- 22 ultrasonically cleaned and then rinsed under running hot water
- 23 prior to being placed in the used instrument container;
- 24 (5) The ultrasonic unit shall be sanitized daily with a

- 1 germicidal solution;
- 2 (6) If used instruments are not ultrasonically cleaned prior
- 3 to being placed in the used instrument container, they shall be
- 4 kept in a germicidal or soap solution until brush scrubbed in hot
- 5 water and soap and then sterilized by autoclaving;
- 6 (7) All nondisposable instruments, including the needle tubes,
- 7 shall be sterilized and shall be handled and stored in such a
- 8 manner as to prevent contamination. Instruments to be sterilized
- 9 shall be sealed in bags made specifically for the purpose of
- 10 autoclaye sterilization and <del>shall</del> include the date of
- 11 sterilization. If nontransparent sterilization bags are utilized,
- 12 the bag shall also list the contents;
- 13 (8) Autoclave sterilization bags, with a color code indicator
- 14 which changes color upon proper steam sterilization, shall be
- 15 utilized during the autoclave sterilization process;
- 16 (9) Instruments shall be placed in the autoclave in such a
- 17 manner as to allow live steam to circulate around them;
- 18 (10) No rusty, defective or faulty instruments shall be kept
- 19 in the studio.
- 20 (f) Aftercare of tattoo. --
- The completed tattoo shall be washed with a single-use towel
- 22 saturated with an antibacterial solution.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to prohibit minors under the age of sixteen from obtaining a tattoo and to require a parent or quardian's written consent for minors over sixteen. Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
