6 chapter. It is subject only to sections 1-105 (separate titles and

8 and building codes) and 1-107 (eminent domain) section one hundred
9 five, article one of this chapter concerning separate titles and
10 taxation; section one hundred six, article one of this chapter
11 concerning applicability of local ordinances, regulations and
12 building codes; and section one hundred seven, article one of this
13 chapter concerning eminent domain unless the declaration provides
14 that this entire chapter is applicable.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to increase homeowners' associations dues so that there is sufficient funding to maintain environmental management plans and streets.
