- 23 its registered office has been discontinued; or
- 24 (3) The corporation's period of duration stated in its

- 9 certificate of authority of a foreign corporation authorized to
- 10 conduct activities in this state if:
- 11 (1) The foreign corporation does not pay within sixty days
- 12 after they are due any franchise taxes or penalties imposed by this
- 13 chapter or other law;
- 14 (2) The foreign corporation does not inform the Secretary of
- 15 State under sections one thousand four hundred eight or one
- 16 thousand four hundred nine of this article that its registered
- 17 agent or registered office has changed, that its registered agent
- 18 has resigned, or that its registered office has been discontinued
- 19 within sixty days of the change, resignation, or discontinuance;
- 20 (3) An incorporator, director, officer, or agent of the
- 21 foreign corporation signed a document he or she knew was false in
- 22 any material respect with intent that the document be delivered to
- 23 the Secretary of State for filing; or
- 24 (4) The Secretary of State receives a duly authenticated
- 25 certificate from the Secretary of State or other official having
- 26 custody of corporate records in the state or country under whose

- 1 law the foreign corporation is incorporated stating that it has
- 2 been dissolved or disappeared as the result of a merger;
- 3 (5) The foreign corporation's professional license has been
- 4 revoked by a professional licensing board; or
- 5 (6) The foreign corporation is in default with the Bureau of
- 6 Employment Programs.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to permit the Secretary of State to dissolve a corporate entity if its professional license has been revoked or is in default with the Bureau of Employment Programs.
