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CHAPTER 6. GENERAL PROVISIONS RESPECTING OFFICERS.

15 ARTICLE 7. COMPENSATION AND ALLOWANCES.

16 §6-7-2a. Terms of certain appointive state officers; appointment;

qualifications; powers and salaries of such officers.

(a) Each of the following appointive state officers named in this subsection shall be appointed by the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate. Each of the appointive state officers serves at the will and pleasure of the Governor for the term for which the Governor was elected and until the respective state officers' successors have been appointed and qualified. Each the appointive state officers are subject to the existing

1 qualifications for holding each respective office and each has and 2 is hereby granted all of the powers and authority and shall perform 3 all of the functions and services heretofore vested in and performed 4 by virtue of existing law respecting each office.

5 Prior to July 1, two thousand six, each such named appointive 6 state officer shall continue to receive the annual salaries they 7 were receiving as of the effective date of the enactment of this 8 section in two thousand six and thereafter, notwithstanding any 9 other provision of this code to the contrary, The annual salary of 10 each named appointive state officer shall be is as follows:

11 Commissioner, Division of Highways, \$92,500; Commissioner, 12 Division of Corrections, \$80,000; Director, Division of Natural 13 Resources, \$75,000; Superintendent, State Police, \$85,000; 14 Commissioner, Division of Banking, \$75,000; Commissioner, Division 15 of Culture and History, \$65,000; Commissioner, Alcohol Beverage 16 Control Commission, \$75,000; Commissioner, Division of Motor 17 Vehicles, \$75,000; Chairman, Health Care Authority, \$80,000; 18 members, Health Care Authority, \$70,000; Director, Human Rights 19 Commission, \$55,000; Commissioner, Division of Labor, \$70,000; 20 Director, Division of Veterans' Affairs, sixty-five thousand 21 dollars; Chairperson, Board of Parole, \$55,000; members, Board of 22 Parole, \$50,000; members, Employment Security Review Board, \$17,000; 23 and Commissioner, Bureau of Employment Programs Workforce West 24 Virginia, \$75,000. Secretaries of the departments shall be paid an 25 annual salary as follows: Health and Human Resources, \$95,000;

1 Transportation, \$95,000: Provided, That if the same person is 2 serving as both the Secretary of Transportation and the Commissioner 3 of Highways, he or she shall be paid \$120,000; Revenue, \$95,000; 4 Military Affairs and Public Safety, \$95,000; Administration, 5 \$95,000; Education and the Arts, \$95,000; Commerce, \$95,000; 6 Veterans' Assistance, \$95,000; and Environmental Protection, 7 \$95,000; Provided, however, That any increase in the salary of any 8 current appointive state officer named in this subsection pursuant 9 to the reenactment of this subsection during the regular session of 10 the Legislature in 2006 that exceeds \$5,000 shall be paid to such 11 officer or his or her successor beginning on July 1, 2006, in annual 12 increments of \$5,000 per fiscal year, up to the maximum salary 13 provided in this subsection: Provided further, That if the same 14 person is serving as both the Secretary of Transportation and the 15 Commissioner of Highways, then the annual increments of \$5,000 per 16 fiscal year do not apply.

17 (b) Each of the state officers named in this subsection shall 18 continue to be appointed in the manner prescribed in this code and, 19 prior to July 1, 2006, each of the state officers named in this 20 subsection shall continue to receive the annual salaries he or she 21 was receiving as of the effective date of the enactment of this 22 section in 2006 and shall thereafter, notwithstanding any other 23 provision of this code to the contrary, be paid an annual salary as 24 follows:

1 Director, Division of Rehabilitation Services, \$70,000; Director, 2 Division of Personnel, \$70,000; Executive Director, Educational 3 Broadcasting Authority, \$75,000; Secretary, Library Commission, 4 \$72,000; Director, Geological and Economic Survey, \$75,000; 5 Executive Director, prosecuting attorneys institute, \$70,000; 6 Executive Director, Public Defender Services, \$70,000; Commissioner, 7 Bureau of Senior Services, \$75,000; Director, State Rail Authority, 8 \$65,000; Executive Director, Women's Commission, \$45,000; Director, 9 Hospital Finance Authority, \$35,000; member, Racing Commission, 10 \$12,000; Chairman, Public Service Commission, \$85,000; members, 11 Public Service Commission, \$85,000; Director, Division of Forestry, 12 \$75,000; Director, Division of Juvenile Services, \$80,000; and 13 Executive Director, Regional Jail and Correctional Facility 14 Authority, \$80,000: Provided, That any increase in the salary of 15 any current appointive state officer named in this subsection 16 pursuant to the reenactment of this subsection during the regular 17 session of the Legislature in 2006 that exceeds \$5,000 shall be paid 18 to such officer or his or her successor beginning on July, 1 2006, 19 in annual increments of \$5,000 per fiscal year, up to the maximum 20 salary provided in this subsection.

(c) Each of the following appointive state officers named in this subsection shall be appointed by the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate. Each of the appointive state officers serves at the will and pleasure of the Governor for the term for which the Governor was elected and until the respective

1 state officers' successors have been appointed and qualified. Each 2 of the appointive state officers are subject to the existing 3 qualifications for holding each respective office and each has and 4 is hereby granted all of the powers and authority and shall perform 5 all of the functions and services heretofore vested in and performed 6 by virtue of existing law respecting each office.

7 Prior to July 1, 2006, each such named appointive state officer 8 shall continue to receive the annual salaries they were receiving 9 as of the effective date of the enactment of this section in 2006 10 and thereafter, notwithstanding any other provision of this code to 11 the contrary, the annual salary of each named appointive state 12 officer shall be as follows:

13 Commissioner, State Tax Division, \$92,500; <u>Insurance</u> 14 Commissioner, Insurance Commission, \$92,500; Director, Lottery 15 Commission, \$92,500; Director, Division of Homeland Security and 16 Emergency Management, \$65,000; and Adjutant General, \$92,500.

17 (d) No increase in the salary of any appointive state officer 18 pursuant to this section shall <u>may</u> be paid until and unless the 19 appointive state officer has first filed with the State Auditor and 20 the Legislative Auditor a sworn statement, on a form to be 21 prescribed by the Attorney General, certifying that his or her 22 spending unit is in compliance with any general law providing for 23 a salary increase for his or her employees. The Attorney General 24 shall prepare and distribute the form to the affected spending 25 units.

CHAPTER 9A. VETERANS' AFFAIRS.

2 ARTICLE 1. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS' AFFAIRS.

3 §9A-1-1. Creation and general purposes.

1

A state agency to be known as Effective the 14th day of 4 5 January, 2013, The the West Virginia Division of Veterans' Affairs 6 is hereby created and established within the Department of Military 7 Affairs and Public Safety redesignated the Department of Veterans' 8 Assistance for the purpose of aiding, assisting, counseling and 9 advising, and looking after the rights and interests of, all persons 10 known as veterans who have served in the Armed Forces of the United 11 States in the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force or Coast Guard as 12 defined by the laws of the United States and whose separation 13 therefrom has been other than dishonorable, and who are citizens and 14 residents of this state, and the widows dependents and orphans, who 15 are or have become citizens and residents of this state, or all 16 persons known as veterans who have served in the Armed Forces of the 17 United States in the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force or Coast 18 Guard as defined by the laws of the United States and whose 19 separation therefrom has been other than dishonorable.

All references in this code to the West Virginia Division of Veterans' Affairs and the Director of the West Virginia Division of Veterans' Affairs mean the Department of Veterans' Assistance and He Secretary of the Department of Veterans' Assistance, respectively.

1 §9A-1-2. Veterans' council; administration of department.

2 There is continued the "Veterans' Council" consisting of nine 3 members who must be citizens and residents of this state and who 4 have served in and been honorably discharged or separated under 5 honorable conditions from the Armed Forces of the United States and 6 whose service was within a time of war as defined by the laws of the 7 United States, either Public Law No. 2 -- 73rd Congress, or Public 8 Law No. 346 -- 78th Congress, and amendments thereto. At least one 9 member of the council must be a veteran of World War II, at least 10 one member of the council must be a veteran of the Korean Conflict, 11 at least two members of the council must be veterans of the Vietnam 12 era, at least one member must be a veteran of the first Gulf War and 13 at least one member must be a veteran of the Afghanistan or Iraqi 14 Conflicts. The members of the veterans' council must be selected 15 with special reference to their ability and fitness to effectuate 16 the purposes of this article.

17 A director <u>secretary</u> and such veterans' affairs officers, 18 assistants and employees as <u>may be deemed</u> <u>the secretary considers</u> 19 advisable, shall administer the West Virginia division of veterans' 20 affairs Department of Veterans' Assistance.

21 §9A-1-4. Duties and functions of Veterans' Council; appointment of 22 secretary; honoring academic achievement at military 23 academies.

24 (a) It is the duty and function of the Veterans' Council to

1 advise the director secretary on the general administrative policies 2 of the division department, to select, at their first meeting in 3 each fiscal year commencing on July 1, a chairman chairperson to 4 serve one year, to advise the director secretary on rules as may be 5 necessary, to advise the Governor and the Legislature with respect 6 to legislation affecting the interests of veterans, their widows, 7 dependents and orphans and to make annual reports to the Governor 8 respecting the service of the division department. The director 9 secretary has the same eligibility and qualifications prescribed for 10 members of the Veterans' Council. The Governor shall appoint a 11 director for a term of six years, by and with the advice and consent 12 of the Senate. Before making the appointment appointing the 13 secretary the Governor shall request the council of the West 14 Virginia division of veterans' affairs to furnish a full and 15 complete report concerning the qualifications and suitability of the 16 proposed appointee. The director may only be removed by the 17 Governor for cause, but shall have upon his or her own request an 18 open hearing before the Governor on the complaints or charges lodged 19 against him or her. The action of the Governor shall be final. The 20 director secretary ex officio shall be is the executive secretary of 21 the Veterans' Council, shall keep the minutes of each meeting and be 22 in charge of all records of the division department.

(b) The Veterans' Council may annually honor each West Virginian graduating from the U.S. Military Academy, the U.S. Naval Academy, the U.S. Air Force Academy and the U.S. Coast Guard Academy

1 with the highest grade point average by bestowing upon him or her 2 the "West Augusta Award." The award shall be in a design and form 3 established by the council and include the famous Revolutionary War 4 phrase from which the award's name is derived: "Once again our 5 brethren from West Augusta have answered the call to duty." The 6 council shall coordinate the manner of recognition of the recipient 7 at graduation ceremonies with each academy.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to redesignate the Division of Veterans' Affairs the Department of Veterans' Assistance and to provide that the department be supervised by a secretary level administrator.
