A BILL to amend and reenact §30-27-5 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to licensure requirements for barbers and cosmetologists; requiring licensees to present government identification; and authorizing the board to retain identification information.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §30-27-5 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 27. BOARD OF BARBERS AND COSMETOLOGISTS.

§30-27-5. Powers and duties of the board.

- 1 (a) The board has all the powers and duties set forth in
- 2 this article, by rule, in article one of this chapter and
- 3 elsewhere in law.
- 4 (b) The board shall:
- 5 (1) Hold meetings, conduct hearings and administer
- 6 examinations;
- 7 (2) Establish requirements for licenses, permits,
- 8 certificates and registrations;
- 9 (3) Establish procedures for submitting, approving and
- 10 rejecting applications for licenses, permits, certificates and
- 11 registrations;
- 12 (4) Determine the qualifications of any applicant for
- 13 licenses, permits, certificates and registrations;
- 14 (5) Prepare, conduct, administer and grade
- examinations for professional licenses and certificates;
- 16 (6) Determine the passing grade for the examinations;

17 (7) Maintain records of the examinations the board or 18 a third party administers, including the number of persons 19 taking the examinations and the pass and fail rate;

- 20 (8) Hire, discharge, establish the job requirements and 21 fix the compensation of the executive director;
- 22 (9) Maintain an office, and hire, discharge, establish the 23 job requirements and fix the compensation of employees, 24 investigators/inspectors and contracted employees necessary to enforce the provisions of this article: 25 26 *Provided*, That any investigator/inspector employed by the 27 board on July 1, 2009, shall retain their coverage under the classified service, including job classification, job tenure 28 and salary, until that person retires or is dismissed: 29 30 Provided, however, That nothing may prohibit the 31 disciplining or dismissal of any investigator/inspector for 32 cause;
- 33 (10) Investigate alleged violations of the provisions of 34 this article, legislative rules, orders and final decisions of 35 the board;

- 36 (11) Establish the criteria for the training of
- 37 investigators/inspectors;
- 38 (12) Set the requirements for investigations and
- 39 inspections;
- 40 (13) Conduct disciplinary hearings of persons regulated
- 41 by the board;
- 42 (14) Determine disciplinary action and issue orders;
- 43 (15) Institute appropriate legal action for the
- 44 enforcement of the provisions of this article;
- 45 (16) Maintain an accurate registry of names and
- addresses of all persons regulated by the board;
- 47 (17) Keep accurate and complete records of its
- 48 proceedings, and certify the same as may be necessary and
- 49 appropriate;
- 50 (18) Establish the continuing education requirements
- for professional licensees and certificate holders;
- 52 (19) Issue, renew, combine, deny, suspend, revoke or
- reinstate licenses, permits, certificates and registrations;
- 54 (20) Establish a fee schedule;

55 (21) Propose rules in accordance with the provisions of 56 article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code to 57 implement the provisions of this article; and (22) Take all other actions necessary and proper to 58 effectuate the purposes of this article. 59 60 (c) The board may: 61 (1) Establish joint licenses; 62 (2) Contract with third parties to administer the 63 examinations required under the provisions of this article; 64 (3) Sue and be sued in its official name as an agency of 65 this state; and (4) Confer with the Attorney General or his or her 66 assistant in connection with legal matters and questions; 67 68 and 69 (5) Require licensees to present a valid United States or

state government issued photo identification. The board

may retain a copy of the government issued identification

to verify licensee information.

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
