A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by

adding thereto a new section, designated §48-5-614, relating to

the revocation of death benefits by divorce.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended

by adding thereto a new section, designated §48-5-614, to read as follows:

**ARTICLE 5. DIVORCE.** 

§48-5-614. Revocation of death benefits by divorce.

1	(a) Upon the entry of the final divorce order, any
2	revocable beneficiary designation contained in a then
3	existing written contract owned by one party that provides
4	for the payment of any death benefit to the other party is
5	revoked. A death benefit prevented from passing to a former
6	spouse by this section shall be paid as if the former spouse
7	had predeceased the decedent. The payor of any death
8	benefit shall be discharged from all liability upon payment in
9	accordance with the terms of the contract providing for the
10	death benefit, unless the payor receives written notice of a
11	revocation under this section prior to payment.
12	(b) The term "death benefit", as used in this section,
13	includes any payment under a life insurance contract,
14	annuity, retirement arrangement, compensation agreement or
15	other contract designating a beneficiary of any right, property
16	or money in the form of a death benefit.
17	(c) This section does not apply:
18	(1) To the extent an order of divorce or a written
19	agreement of the parties provides for a contrary result as to

## 21 (2) To any trust or any death benefit payable to or under 22 any trust.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to revoke certain death benefits by divorce. This section is new; therefore, it has been completely underscored.
