A BILL to amend and reenact §61-3C-14a of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, and to amend and reenact §61-8-16 of said code, all relating to crimes using computers, telephones and electronic communications devices; creating offenses for the unlawful transmission of obscene, anonymous, harassing and threatening communications and data by mobile phone, personal digital assistant or other electronic Com. Sub. for H.B. 3029] 2 communications device; clarifying provisions pertaining to the unlawful obscene, anonymous, harassing and threatening communications by traditional voice communication by telephone; creating a felony offense for certain repeat offenses using a computer, mobile phone or other electronic communications device; and establishing criminal penalties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §61-3C-14a of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted; and §61-8-16 of said code be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

ARTICLE 3C. WEST VIRGINIA COMPUTER AND <u>MOBILE DEVICES</u> CRIME AND ABUSE ACT.

§61-3C-14a. Obscene, anonymous, harassing and threatening communications by computer, <u>cell phones and</u> <u>electronic communication devices;</u> penalty.

(a) It is unlawful for any person, with the intent to harass
 or abuse another person, to use a computer, <u>mobile phone</u>,
 <u>personal digital assistant or other electronic communication</u>
 device to:

5 (1) Make contact with another without disclosing his or 6 her identity with the intent to harass or abuse; 7 (2) Make contact with a person after being requested by 8 the person to desist from contacting them; 9 (3) Threaten to commit a crime against any person or 10 property; or 11 (4) Cause obscene material to be delivered or transmitted to a specific person after being requested to desist from 12 13 sending such material. 14 (b)(1) For purposes of this section, the "use of a computer, mobile phone, personal digital assistant or other 15 16 electronic communication device" includes, but is not limited 17 to, the transmission of text messages, electronic mail, 18 photographs, videos, images or other nonvoice data by means 19 of an electronic communication system, and includes the transmission of such data to another's computer, e-mail 20 21 account, mobile phone, personal digital assistant or other electronic communication device. 22

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23 (5) For purposes of this section, "obscene material"
24 means material that:

(A) An average person, applying contemporary adult
community standards, would find, taken as a whole, appeals
to the prurient interest, is intended to appeal to the prurient
interest, or is pandered to a prurient interest;

(B) An average person, applying contemporary adult
community standards, would find, depicts or describes, in a
patently offensive way, sexually explicit conduct consisting
of an ultimate sexual act, normal or perverted, actual or
simulated, an excretory function, masturbation, lewd
exhibition of the genitals, or sadomasochistic sexual abuse;
and

36 (C) A reasonable person would find, taken as a whole,
37 lacks literary, artistic, political or scientific value.

(b) (c) It is unlawful for any person to knowingly permit
 a computer, mobile phone or personal digital assistant or
 other electronic communication device under his or her
 control to be used for any purpose prohibited by this section.

[Com. Sub. for H.B. 3029 42 (c) (d) Any offense committed under this section may be 43 determined to have occurred at the place at which the contact 44 originated or the place at which the contact was received or 45 intended to be received.

46 (d) (e) Any person who violates a provision of this 47 section is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction 48 thereof, shall be fined not more than \$500 or confined in a49 county or regional jail not more than six months, or both 50 fined and confined. For a second or subsequent offense, the 51 person is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction 52 thereof, shall be fined not more than \$1,000 or confined in a 53 county or regional jail for not more than one year, or both fined and confined. For a third or subsequent offense, the 54 55 person is guilty of a felony and, upon conviction thereof, 56 shall be imprisoned in a state correctional facility not less than one year nor more two years and fined not more than 57 58 \$5,000.

ARTICLE 8. CRIMES AGAINST CHASTITY, MORALITY AND DECENCY.

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§61-8-16. Obscene, anonymous, harassing, repeated and threatening telephone calls; penalty.

(a) It shall be is unlawful for any person with intent to
 harass or abuse another by means of telephone to:

- 3 (1) Make any comment, request, suggestion or proposal4 which is obscene; or
- 5 (2) Make a telephone call, whether or not conversation
- 6 ensues, without disclosing his <u>or her</u> identity and with intent
- 7 to harass any person at the called number; or
- 8 (3) Make or cause the telephone of another repeatedly or
 9 continuously to ring, with intent to harass any person at the
 10 called number; or

(4) Make repeated telephone calls, during which
conversation ensues, with intent to harass any person at the
called number; or

14 (5) Threaten to commit a crime against any person or15 property.

(b) It shall be unlawful for any person to knowingly
permit any telephone under his <u>or her</u> control to be used for
any purpose prohibited by this section.

7 [Com. Sub. for H.B. 3029 19 (c) Any offense committed under this section may be 20 deemed to have occurred at the place at which the telephone 21 call was made, or the place at which the telephone call was 22 received.

(d) Any person who violates any provision of this section
shall be is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction
thereof, shall be fined not more than \$500, or imprisoned
<u>confined</u> in the county jail not more than six months, or both
fined and imprisoned <u>confined</u>.
