A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section, designated §31-2-16, relating to railroad companies providing pesticide safety; requiring a railroad company to provide pesticide safety information at a central location accessible to employees of the railroad company and to the public and local communities along the

right-of-way treated by pesticide use; and requiring a railroad company to provide pesticide safety training annually to its employees who work along railroad rights-of-way and in rail yards.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new section, designated §31-2-16, to read as follows:

ARTICLE 2. RAILROAD COMPANIES.

§31-2-16. Railroad company pesticide use.

- 1 (a) No later than seven days before applying a pesticide
- 2 to a right-of-way that a railroad company owns or
- 3 maintains, the railroad company shall provide pesticide
- 4 safety information, which may be obtained by the railroad
- 5 company's contracted pesticide applicator, by posting at
- 6 affected on-duty railroad locations and through train
- 7 bulletins, dispatcher messages, or other required
- 8 documentation for each train and engine crew that will be
- 9 working in the affected pesticide spray area. Additionally, the

10 railroad company shall provide appropriate documentation to ensure prompt notification for maintenance of way, 11 mechanical, signal employees, or other rail workers that will 12 13 be working in the affected pesticide spray area. A railroad company shall include all of the following in the safety 14 15 information provided under this subdivision: 16 (1) The location and description of the area to be treated. 17 (2) The name of the pesticide, its active ingredients, and 18 its registration number under 7 U.S.C. §§ 136 et seq. The 19 material safety data sheet(MSDS) for the pesticide shall 20 satisfy this purpose. 21 (3) The approximate date and time that the pesticide is to 22 be applied. (4) Any restricted entry interval specified on the pesticide 23 24 labeling. The MSDS for the pesticide shall satisfy this 25 purpose. Provided, That the railroad company shall not 26 require an employee to reenter the pesticide spray area prior 27 to the requirements specified by the MSDS on the pesticide 28 being utilized, *Provided however*, That train and/or on-track

movement is not prohibited.

30 (5) A description of where the information required to be 31 on the pesticide label under 7 U.S.C. §§ 136 et seg or under 32 the provisions of article sixteen-a, chapter nineteen of this code is available for review. The MSDS for the pesticide 33 34 shall satisfy this purpose. 35 (6) Emergency medical contact information. 36 (b) A railroad company shall keep the information 37 required by subsection (a) posted at the location accessible to employees of the railroad for at least thirty days after the day 38 39 of application. 40 (c) No later than seven days before applying a pesticide 41 to a right-of-way that a railroad company owns or maintains, 42 the railroad company shall provide all of the following to 43 each individual who directly supervises employees who work 44 in the area to be treated: 45 (1) The information described in subdivision (2) to (6) of 46 subsection (a); and 47 (2) A description of the central location where the 48 railroad company provides the pesticide safety information

to employees under the provisions of subsection (a).

50 (d) No later than seven days before applying a pesticide 51 to a right-of-way that a railroad company owns or 52 maintains, the railroad company must provide the location 53 and description of the area to be treated, the approximate date 54 and time of the application, and how to obtain answers to 55 questions about the pesticide application, including a telephone number for the railroad company and any toll-free 56 telephone number maintained by the railroad company to the 57 58 Commissioner of Agriculture of the State of West Virginia. 59 It is the duty of the Commissioner of Agriculture to provide 60 public notification per their normal legislative rules and 61 regulations, which should include, but not be limited to, notifying each county and municipal law-enforcement 62 63 agency with jurisdiction over the area in which the pesticide will be applied, the location and description of the area to be 64 65 treated, the approximate date and time of the application, and how to obtain answers to questions about the pesticide 66 67 application, including a telephone number for the railroad 68 company and any toll-free telephone number maintained by 69 the railroad company.

70 (e) A railroad company shall make available to the public 71 on its Internet site a description of how to obtain answers to 72 questions about pesticide use by the railroad company, including a telephone number for the railroad and any 73 74 toll-free number maintained by the railroad company or the 75 Commissioner of Agriculture of the State of West Virginia to 76 provide information about pesticide use. 77 (f) A railroad company shall provide annual pesticide 78 safety training. This training may coincide with the annual 79 railroad operating rules class or at any other operating or 80 safety training class that is scheduled annually. This training 81 shall be provided to railroad employees who work along railroad rights-of-way and in rail yards and to other 82 83 employees who, due to the nature of their employment, may 84 work in areas to which pesticides have been applied. It is the duty of the railroad company to keep records for each 85 86 training session, which should include, but not be limited to, 87 the date of the training session, the employees attending, and the name of the trainer and the trainer's employer. In the 88

Sub. for H.B. 3126 7 89 training under this subsection, a railroad company shall 90 include, but not be limited to, information about restricted 91 entry intervals, requirements for personal protective equipment, how to read pesticide labels, and incident and 92 93 complaint reporting. (g) For purposes of this section, the term "pesticide" is 94 defined by section three, article sixteen-a, chapter nineteen of 95 this code. 96
