A BILL to amend and reenact §11-16-4 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended; and to amend and reenact §60-2-12 of said code, all relating to the Alcohol Beverage Control Commission; requiring the Division of Personnel review and evaluate the employees of the Alcohol Beverage Control Commission; permitting Alcohol Beverage Control Commission employees to be included in the civil service;

providing exemption of inclusion of certain positions; requiring a report to the legislature; and removing out-dated language from the code.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §11-16-4 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted; and that §60-2-12 be amended and reenacted; all to read as follows:

CHAPTER 11. TAXATION.

ARTICLE 16. NONINTOXICATING BEER.

- §11-16-4. Responsibility of Alcohol Beverage Control Commissioner; administrators, employees and agents; administration and enforcement expenses.
 - 1 (a) The Alcohol Beverage Control Commissioner
 - 2 described under the provisions of article two, chapter sixty of
 - 3 this code shall have sole responsibility for the administration
 - 4 of this article, except for those responsibilities expressly
 - 5 vested in the Tax Commissioner under sections thirteen,
 - 6 fourteen and fifteen of this article

7 All acts heretofore performed by the nonintoxicating beer commissioner under previous proceedings of this article are 8 9 hereby again ratified and confirmed, and the commissioner shall succeed to the same position previously maintained by 10 the nonintoxicating beer commissioner in all proceedings and official acts instituted and perfected under the provisions of 12 13 this article prior to the effective date of this section.

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(b) The commissioner shall appoint an adequate number of competent persons to serve as administrators, employees and agents of the commissioner for the purpose of keeping all necessary accounts and records required under the provisions of this article; investigating the books, accounts, records and other papers of retailers, distributors and brewers; investigating applicants for license and the places of business of retailers, distributors and brewers; procuring evidence with respect to violations of the provisions of this article, and particularly for use at hearings held by the commissioner and on proceedings instituted in court for the purpose of revoking or suspending licenses hereunder; and

26 such administrators, employees and agents shall perform 27 such other duties as the commissioner may direct. Such 28 administrators, employees and agents shall have the right to 29 enter any licensed premises in the state in the performance of 30 their duties at any hour of the day or night when beer is being 31 sold or consumed on such licensed premises. Refusal by any 32 licensee or by any employee of a licensee to permit such 33 administrators, employees or agents to enter the licensed 34 premises shall be an additional cause for revocation or suspension of the license of such licensee by the 35 36 commissioner. The compensation of such administrators, 37 employees and agents shall be fixed by the commissioner: 38 Provided, That the commissioner may employ up to eleven 39 special investigators who shall be nonclassified exempt employees of the division. 40 41 (c) Services rendered the state by clerks, sheriffs, 42 commissioners in chancery and special commissioners, 43 designated by the court, and court reporters

stenographers performing services for said commissioner and

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45 fees of witnesses summoned on behalf of the state in 46 proceedings to revoke or suspend retailer's licenses shall be 47 treated as part of the expenses of administration and 48 enforcement, and such officers and said other persons shall be 49 paid the same fees and charges as would be chargeable for like 50 services performed for an individual; and the compensation of 51 such clerks, sheriffs and other persons shall be paid out of the 52 amount allocated for the expense of administration enforcement, 53 after the amount of such fees and other charges shall be certified 54 by the court to the Auditor.

CHAPTER 60. STATE CONTROL OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUORS.

ARTICLE 2. ALCOHOL BEVERAGE CONTROL COMMISSIONER.

§60-2-12. Assistants and employees.

- 1 (a) The commission shall appoint or employ such
- 2 assistants and employees persons as may be necessary to the
- 3 efficient operation of the department. and fix their salaries.
- 4 All assistants and employees shall be appointed or employed
- 5 to serve during the will and pleasure of the commission.

- 6 (b) An employee who is in a position that is not part of 7 the classified system may be added to the classified service under the Division of Personnel by July 1, 2012. The 8 9 Division of Personnel shall review the organization and employment structure of the Alcohol Beverage Control 10 11 Administration and report to the Joint Committee on 12 Government and Finance before December 31, 2011 with a 13 recommendation as to the process for the transition of such 14 employees. 15 (c) The division shall review and evaluate each 16 employee's job duties and qualifications to determine which 17 classification and compensation is appropriate for that 18 employee. 19 (d) Upon completion of the division's review and 20 evaluation, the employee will be provided with his or her written review and evaluation in a meeting with the staff of 21 22 the Division of Personnel.
- 23 (e) The division shall classify the employee in the 24 appropriate classification for the job duties which the

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- 25 employee performs: *Provided*, That the employee's salary or
- benefits may not be reduced.
- 27 (f) The commissioner, deputy commissioners and
- 28 division directors are exempt from the classified service:
- 29 Provided, That if a division director is currently in classified
- 30 service, that director shall retain his or her classified status.
