COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

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Senate Bill No. 229

(By Senators Kessler (Acting President) and Hall, By Request of the Executive)

[Originating in the Committee on Finance; reported February 23, 2011.]

A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new article, designated §18-2F-1, §18-2F-2, §18-2F-3, §18-2F-4, §18-2F-5 and §18-2F-6, all relating to creating the Math and Science Teacher Loan Assistance Program; providing legislative purpose; defining certain terms; creating a special revenue fund; requiring legislative rules; establishing procedures for identifying public schools or geographic areas in critical need of math and science teachers;

administering loan assistance program; authorizing solicitation and certain match of private funds; providing selection criteria and procedures for candidates; requiring certain agreements and contracts; establishing conditions for addressing renewal, noncompliance, deferral and exceptions; and setting limits on amount of loan assistance per recipient.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new article, designated \$18-2F-1, \$18-2F-2, \$18-2F-3, \$18-2F-4, \$18-2F-5 and \$18-2F-6, all to read as follows:

ARTICLE 2F. MATH AND SCIENCE TEACHER LOAN ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

§18-2F-1. Definitions.

- 1 For the purposes of this article, the following words have
- 2 the meanings ascribed to them unless the context clearly
- 3 indicates a different meaning:
- 4 "Agreement" means the loan assistance contract between
- 5 the department and the certified teacher seeking an award;
- 6 "Area of critical need" means a school or geographic area
- 7 of West Virginia identified by the department where there
- 8 exists a critical shortage of math and science teachers;

- 9 "Award" means a monetary amount paid from the Math and
- 10 Science Teacher Loan Assistance Fund to an eligible recipi-
- 11 ent's educational loan institution pursuant to this article;
- 12 "Department" means the West Virginia Department of
- 13 Education;
- 14 "Fund" or "loan fund" means the Math and Science
- 15 Teacher Loan Assistance Fund created pursuant to this
- 16 article;
- 17 "Program" means the Math and Science Teacher Loan
- 18 Assistance Program created pursuant to this article; and
- "Recipient" means a certified math or science teacher who
- 20 is eligible to receive an award pursuant to the terms of this
- 21 article and state board rule.

§18-2F-2. Loan assistance program created; purpose; funding; legislative rule required.

- 1 (a) There is hereby created the "Math and Science Teacher
- 2 Loan Assistance Program". The purpose of the program is to
- 3 improve the quality of education in the public schools of the
- 4 state by attracting and retaining West Virginia teachers who
- 5 are certified to teach math and science in areas of critical
- 6 need.

- 7 (b) There is hereby created in the State Treasury a special
- 8 revenue fund known as the "Math and Science Teacher Loan"
- 9 Assistance Fund" to be administered by the department
- 10 solely for the purposes set forth in this article.
- 11 (1) Any moneys appropriated or otherwise designated or
- 12 accruing to the fund and all earnings payable to it, including,
- 13 but not limited to, those funds identified in subsection (e) of
- 14 this section, shall be deposited into the fund.
- 15 (2) The loan fund shall operate as a special revenue fund
- 16 whereby all deposits and payments to the loan fund do not
- 17 expire to the General Revenue Fund, but remain in the loan
- 18 fund and are available for expenditure in succeeding fiscal
- 19 years. Balances in the loan fund shall be invested with the
- 20 state's consolidated investment fund.
- 21 (3) Expenditures from the fund are authorized from
- 22 collections.
- 23 (4) Any moneys repaid to the department by reason of
- 24 default of an agreement made pursuant to this article also
- 25 shall be deposited into the fund.
- 26 (c) The state board shall promulgate a legislative rule in
- 27 accordance with the provisions of article three-b, chapter
- 28 twenty-nine-a of this code for the administration of the

- 29 program in furtherance of the purposes of this article. The
- 30 rule shall include, but is not limited to, the following:
- 31 (1) Establishing criteria and procedures for identifying
- 32 public schools or geographic areas in critical need of math
- 33 and science teachers;
- 34 (2) Awarding loan assistance, including establishing
- 35 conditions under which partial awards may be granted for
- 36 less than a full year of teaching in an area of critical need;
- 37 (3) Determining eligibility for loan assistance renewal;
- 38 (4) Establishing criteria for determining participant
- 39 compliance or noncompliance with terms of the agreement
- 40 and establishing procedures to address noncompliance
- 41 including, but not limited to, repayment, deferral and
- 42 excusal;
- 43 (5) Establishing procedures ensuring that loan assistance
- 44 funds are paid directly to the proper lending entity; and
- 45 (6) Developing model agreements.
- 46 (d) In accordance with the legislative rule promulgated
- 47 pursuant to subsection (c) of this section, the department
- 48 shall establish appropriate guidelines for program operation.
- 49 (e) The department may accept and deposit into the fund
- 50 any gift, grant, contribution, bequest, endowment or other

- 51 moneys designated to be used for the purposes of this article
- 52 and may expend these funds as provided in this article and
- 53 by state board rule.
- 54 (f) The department shall encourage support for the pro-
- 55 gram from private sources and may set aside up to one half
- 56 of the funds appropriated by the Legislature to match two
- 57 state dollars for each private dollar from a nonstate source
- 58 deposited into the fund.

§18-2F-3. Selection criteria and procedures.

- 1 (a) Eligibility for an award is limited to a teacher who
- 2 meets the following requirements:
- 3 (1) Has earned a teaching degree and is certified to teach
- 4 math or science in the public schools of West Virginia. A
- 5 certified math or science teacher who is enrolled in advanced
- 6 degree courses or who has earned an advanced degree may
- 7 apply for an award to be paid toward current or future
- 8 education loans;
- 9 (2) Has agreed to teach, or currently is teaching, math or
- 10 science in a state school or geographic area of the state
- 11 identified as an area of critical need.
- 12 (b) In accordance with the rule promulgated pursuant to
- 13 section two of this article, the department shall develop

- 14 criteria and procedures for the administration of the pro-
- 15 gram. These shall include, but are not limited to, ensuring
- 16 that awards are given only on the condition that the recipi-
- 17 ent adheres to an agreement to teach math or science in the
- 18 identified school or geographic area of critical need.
- 19 (c) The department shall make available program applica-
- 20 tion forms to public and private schools in the state via the
- 21 department's website and in other locations convenient to
- 22 potential applicants.

§18-2F-4. Loan assistance agreement.

- 1 (a) Before receiving an award, each eligible teacher shall
- 2 enter into an agreement with the department and shall meet
- 3 the following criteria:
- 4 (1) Provide the department with evidence of compliance
- 5 with subsection (a), section five of this article;
- 6 (2) Teach math or science full-time under contract with a
- 7 county board in an area of critical need for a period of one
- 8 school year for each year for which loan assistance is
- 9 received pursuant to this article. The department may grant
- 10 a partial award to an eligible recipient whose contract term
- 11 is for less than a full school year pursuant to criteria estab-
- 12 lished by state board rule.

- 13 (3) Acknowledge that an award is to be paid to the recipi-
- 14 ent's educational loan institution, not directly to the recipi-
- 15 ent, only after the department determines that the recipient
- 16 has complied with all terms of the agreement; and
- 17 (4) Repay all or part of an award received pursuant to this
- 18 article if the award is not paid to the educational loan
- 19 institution or if the recipient does not comply with the other
- 20 terms of the agreement.
- 21 (b) Each agreement shall fully disclose the terms and
- 22 conditions under which an award may be granted pursuant
- 23 to this article and under which repayment may be required.
- 24 The agreement also shall include the conditions and proce-
- 25 dures established by section five of this article.

§18-2F-5. Renewal conditions; noncompliance; deferral; excusal.

- 1 (a) The recipient is eligible for renewal only during the
- 2 periods when the recipient is under contract with a county
- 3 board to teach math or science in a school or geographic area
- 4 of critical need and complies with other criteria and condi-
- 5 tions the state board establishes by rule.
- 6 (b) A recipient is not in violation of the agreement entered
- 7 into under section four of this article during any period in
- 8 which the recipient meets the following conditions:

- 9 (1) Serves as a member of the armed services of the United
- 10 States for a period not to exceed four years; or
- 11 (2) Is unable to fulfill the agreement due to death, perma-
- 12 nent or temporary disability or a condition covered under the
- 13 Family and Medical Leave Act of 1993.

§18-2F-6. Amount and duration of loan assistance; limits.

- 1 (a) Each award recipient is eligible to receive assistance of
- 2~ up to \$2,000 annually subject to limits set forth in subsection
- 3 (b) of this section:
- 4 (1) If the recipient has taught math or science for a full
- 5 school year under contract with a county board in a school
- 6 or geographic area of critical need; and
- 7 (2) If the recipient otherwise has complied with the terms
- 8 of the agreement and with provisions of this article and any
- 9 rules promulgated pursuant thereto.
- 10 (b) No recipient may receive loan assistance pursuant to
- 11 this article which accumulates in excess of \$10,000.
