(By Senators Williams, Miller, Wills, Sypolt and Klempa)

[Originating in the Committee on the Judiciary; reported February 10, 2011.]

A BILL to amend and reenact §19-20-14, §19-20-15, §19-20-16, §19-20-17 and §19-20-18 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, all relating to adding captive cervids to the list of animals protected from dogs which have killed, wounded or worried any of the listed animals; recovering damages; assessing damages by appraisers; killing a dog lawfully; harboring a dog unlawfully; and providing penalties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §19-20-14, §19-20-15, §19-20-16, §19-20-17 and §19-20-18 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

ARTICLE 20. DOGS AND CATS.

§19-20-14. Dog killing, wounding or worrying livestock; captive cervids or poultry; recovery of damages.

1 If any dog has killed or assisted in killing, wounding or worrying any sheep, lambs, goats, kids, calves, cattle, swine, 23 show or breeding rabbits, horses, colts, captive cervids or poultry out of the enclosure of the owner of the dog, the 4 5 owner or keeper of the dog shall be liable for the sheep, lambs, goats, kids, calves, cattle, swine, show or breeding 6 rabbits, horses, colts, captive cervids or poultry in the 7 amount of the damages sustained, to be recovered in an 8 9 action before any court or magistrate having jurisdiction of 10 the action. It shall not be necessary to sustain the action to prove that the owner of the dog knew the dog was accus-11 tomed to worrying, killing or wounding. A recovery under 12this section shall bar and preclude bars the owner of the 1314 sheep, lambs, goats, kids, calves, cattle, swine, show or 15breeding rabbits, horses, colts, captive cervids or poultry from obtaining compensation from the county commission 16under the provisions of this article. If the person suffering 17 the loss or damage cannot ascertain the owner or keeper of 18 19the dog, or if the owner or keeper is not financially responsi3 [Com. Sub. for S. B. No. 303

ble, then the person suffering the loss or damage may file his 20or her claim with and prove the same before the county 2122commission of the county in which the loss or damage is 23sustained, in the manner provided in this article, and the 24commission shall pay the loss or damage out of the fund provided for such purposes and according to the provisions 25of this article. When compensation is so obtained from the 26county commission, the county commission is authorized to 2728sue under this section and recover as the owner of the sheep, 29lambs, goats, kids, calves, cattle, swine, show or breeding rabbits, horses, colts, captive cervids or poultry. The amount 30 so recovered shall be paid into the county treasury but no 31suit shall may be commenced unless authorized by the 3233 county commission.

§19-20-15. Dog killing, wounding or worrying livestock; captive cervids or poultry; assessment of damages; appraisers.

1 Authority is hereby given to magistrates and notaries 2 public within this state, and within their respective jurisdic-3 tions, to summon three substantial, upright and worthy bona 4 fide residents, citizens and taxpayers of his <u>or her</u> county to 5 assess the damages suffered by <u>any a</u> person on account of Com. the destruction, loss or injury of any sheep, lambs, goats, 6 7 kids, calves, cattle, swine, show or breeding rabbits, horses, 8 colts, captive cervids or poultry by dogs within the county. 9 The appraisers shall be appointed upon the request of a person suffering damages on account of such destruction, 1011 loss or injury. The appraisers shall go upon the ground and 12investigate fully the extent of the destruction, loss or injury, taking all the evidence deemed necessary to arrive at the 1314 facts to be passed upon in arriving at the amount of damage, 15if any, suffered by the party making the complaint. Before the appraisers may be summoned by the magistrate or notary 16public, the complainant shall be is required to make a sworn 17complaint before the magistrate or notary public, setting out 18 19in plain, easily comprehensible terms the facts concerning 20his or her damages to the best of his or her knowledge. After making a full investigation of the facts involved, the apprais-2122ers, with the assistance of the magistrate or notary public, shall make a sworn statement and report the facts ascer-23tained and the damages suffered. The report and statement 2425shall be filed with the county commission or the clerk thereof in vacation. The fees and mileage for services allowed in such 26cases shall be the same as are allowed magistrates, witnesses 27

and arbitrators in magistrates' courts in this state for similar 28 29services. In the event that If the appraisers find that the 30 complainant has suffered no damage, then the complainant 31shall be is responsible for and pay all the costs and expenses 32of the proceeding. In the event that If the complainant has suffered damages on account of the destruction, loss or 33 injury of his or her domestic animals, according to the 34finding of the appraisers, the owner, keeper or person 3536 permitting the dog or dogs causing the damage to remain 37upon the premises under his <u>or her</u> control shall be is liable for all damages sustained by the complainant, including all 38 costs and necessary expenses. All of the damages shall be 39 collectible by an action at law before any court or magistrate 40 41 having jurisdiction of the matter. All papers in connection 42with any a claim shall be filed and preserved in the office of 43 the clerk of the county commission.

§19-20-16. Dog killing, wounding or worrying livestock; captive cervids or poultry; when lawful to kill dog.

A person may kill a dog that he <u>or she may see observes</u>
 chasing, worrying, wounding or killing any sheep, lambs,
 goats, kids, calves, cattle, swine, show or breeding rabbits,
 horses, colts, <u>captive cervids</u> or poultry outside of the

5 enclosure of the owner of the dog, unless the chasing or
6 worrying be done by the direction of the owner of the sheep,
7 lambs, goats, kids, calves, cattle, swine, show or breeding
8 rabbits or horses and colts, <u>captive cervids</u> or poultry.

§19-20-17. Dog killing, wounding or worrying livestock; captive cervids or poultry; unlawful to harbor dog; penalty.

1 A person who shall harbor or secrete or aid harbors, secretes or aids in secreting a dog which he or she knows or 2 has reasons to believe has worried, chased or killed any 3 4 sheep, lambs, goats, kids, calves, cattle, swine, show or breeding rabbits, horses, colts, captive cervids or poultry not 5 the property of the owner of the dog, out of his or her 6 7 enclosure, or knowingly permits the same to be done on any 8 premises under his or her control, is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, before any court or magistrate 9 having jurisdiction thereof in the county in which the offense 10 is committed, shall be fined not less than ten dollars \$10 nor 11 12more than fifty dollars, <u>\$50</u>, and, at the discretion of the 13court or magistrate, imprisoned in the county jail not more than thirty days. Each day that the dog is harbored, kept or 14 15 secreted shall constitute constitutes a separate offense.

§19-20-18. Dog killing, wounding or worrying livestock; captive cervids or poultry; duty of owner to kill dog; proceeding before magistrate on failure of owner to kill.

The owner or keeper of a dog that has been worrying, 1 wounding, chasing or killing any sheep, lambs, goats, kids, 23 calves, cattle, swine, show or breeding rabbits, horses, colts, <u>captive cervids</u> or poultry not the property of the owner or 4 keeper, out of his or her enclosure, shall, within forty-eight 5 hours after having received notice thereof in writing from a 6 7 reliable and trustworthy source, under oath, kill the dog or direct that the dog be killed. If the owner or keeper refuses 8 to kill the dog as hereinbefore provided, the magistrate, upon 9 information, shall summon the owner or keeper of the dog, 10 and, after receiving satisfactory proof that this dog did the 11 mischief, shall issue a warrant on application being made by 12the owner of the sheep, lambs, goats, kids, calves, cattle, 13swine, show or breeding rabbits, horses, or colts, captive 14 15<u>cervids</u> or poultry killed and give it into the hands of to the sheriff, who shall kill the dog forthwith or dispose of by 1617 other available methods. The cost of the proceedings shall be 18 paid by the owner or keeper of the dog so killed, including a

fee of fifty cents 50 c to the officer killing the dog. The owner 19or keeper of the dog, so killed shall, in addition to the costs, 2021be in addition to the costs, is liable to the owner of the sheep, lambs, goats, kids, calves, cattle, swine, show or breeding 2223rabbits, horses, colts, captive cervids or poultry or to the county commission for the value of the sheep, lambs, goats, 2425kids, calves, cattle, swine, show or breeding rabbits, horses or colts, captive cervids or poultry so killed or injured. 26
