H.B. 2946

(By Delegates Ellem, Border, Perdue, Miley, Ellington, Hamilton, Reynolds, Kominar and C. Miller)

[Introduced January 31, 2011; referred to the Committee on Health and Human Resources then the Judiciary.]

A BILL to amend and reenact §60A-10-7 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to the Methamphetamine Laboratory Eradication Act and requiring a prescription dispensing of drug products that contain as an active ingredient containing ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, phenylpropanolamine and other chemical precursors of methamphetamine.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §60A-10-7 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 10. METHAMPHETAMINE LABORATORY ERADICATION ACT.

§60A-10-7. Restricted products; rule-making authority.

(a) On or before July 1, 2005, The Board of Pharmacy 1 2 shall promulgate emergency and legislative rules pursuant to 3 the provision of article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this 4 code to implement a program wherein the Board of Pharmacy 5 shall consult consults with the Superintendent of the State Police in identifying drug products which are a designated 6 7 precursor, in addition to those that contain as their single an ephedrine, pseudoephedrine 8 ingredient active 9 phenylpropanolamine, that are commonly being used in the 10 production and distribution of methamphetamine. Those 11 drug products which the Superintendent of the State Police 12 have demonstrated by empirical evidence are commonly used 13 in the manufacture of methamphetamine shall be added to a supplemental list and shall be are subject to all of the 14 15 restrictions of this article. These The rules established 16 pursuant to this section shall include (1) a process whereby pharmacies are made aware of all drug products that contain 17 18 their single an active ingredient ephedrine, as

- pseudoephedrine and phenylpropanolamine that will be listed
 as a Schedule V III substance. and must be sold, transferred
- 21 or dispensed from behind a pharmacy counter;
- 22 (2) A process whereby pharmacies and retail
 23 establishments are made aware of additional drug products
 24 added to Schedule V that are required to be placed behind the
 25 pharmacy counter for sale, transfer or distribution can be
 26 periodically reviewed and updated.
- (b) At any time after July 1, 2005, the Board of 27 Pharmacy, upon the recommendation of the superintendent 28 29 of the State Police, shall promulgate emergency and 30 legislative rules pursuant to the provision of article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code to implement an updated 31 32 supplemental list of products containing the controlled substances ephedrine, pseudoephedrine or 33 phenylpropanolamine as an active ingredient or any other 34 35 drug used as a precursor in the manufacture of methamphetamine, which the superintendent of the State 36 Police has demonstrated by empirical evidence is being used 37

- 38 in the manufacture of methamphetamine. This listing process
- 39 shall comport with the requirements of subsection (a) of this
- 40 section.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to add language to West Virginia Code §60A-10-7 requiring the issuance of a lawful prescription for dispensing drug products containing as an active ingredient ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, phenylpropanolamine and other chemical precursors of methamphetamine.
