Senate Bill No. 507

(By Senators Kessler (Acting President), Unger, Browning, Foster, Plymale, Stollings, Klempa and Williams)

[Introduced February 14, 2011; referred to the Committee on Government Organization.]

A BILL to amend and reenact §31-15C-3 and §31-15C-14 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, all relating to the continuation of the Broadband Deployment Council.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §31-15C-3 and §31-15C-14 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as

follows:

ARTICLE 15C. Broadband Deployment.

§31-15C-3. Broadband Deployment Council established; members of council; administrative support.

1 (a) The Broadband Deployment Council is hereby estab-

2 lished. continued. The council is a governmental instrumen-

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tality of the state. The exercise by the council of the powers
conferred by this article and the carrying out of its purpose
and duties shall be are considered and held to be, and are
hereby determined to be, essential governmental functions
and for a public purpose. The council is created under the
Department of Commerce for administrative, personnel and
technical support services only.

10 (b) The council shall consist of eleven voting members,11 designated as follows:

12 (1) The Governor or his or her designee;

13 (2) The Secretary of Commerce or his or her designee;

14 (3) The Secretary of Administration or his or her designee;

15 (4) The Director of Homeland Security and Emergency16 Management or his or her designee; and

17 (5) Seven public members that serve at the will and18 pleasure of the Governor and are appointed by the Governor19 with the advice and consent of the Senate, as follows:

20 (i) One member representing employees of communications

21 and cable providers who shall be is a member or representa-

22 tive of a union representing communications workers;

23 (ii) One member representing telecommunications provid-

24 ers who provide broadband services in this state;

25 (iii) One member representing cable operators who provide
26 broadband services in this state;

27 (iv) One member representing broadband equipment or28 device manufacturers;

(v) One member representing higher education or second-ary education; and

(vi) Two members representing the general public who are
residents of the state, *Provided*, That one member represent
rural communities: *Provided*, *however*, That both members
may not reside in the same congressional district. <u>one of</u>
<u>whom shall represent rural communities</u>, and who may not
reside in the same congressional district.

(6) In addition to the eleven voting members of the council,
the President of the Senate shall name two senators from the
West Virginia Senate and the Speaker of the House shall
name two delegates from the West Virginia House of Delegates, each to serve in the capacity of an ex officio, nonvoting advisory member of the council.

43 (c) The Secretary of Commerce or his or her designee shall
44 chair the council and appoint one of the other council
45 members to serve as vice chair. In the absence of the Secre46 tary of Commerce or his or her designee, the vice chair shall

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47 serve as chair. The council shall appoint a secre48 tary-treasurer who need not be a member of the council and
49 who, among other tasks or functions designated by the
50 council, shall keep records of its proceedings.

(d) The council may appoint committees or subcommittees
to investigate and make recommendations to the full council.
Members of these committees or subcommittees need not be
members of the council.

(e) Six voting members of the council shall constitute
<u>constitutes</u> a quorum and the affirmative vote of at least the
majority of those members present shall be is necessary for
any action taken by vote of the council.

59 (f) The council is part-time. Public members appointed by 60 the Governor may pursue and engage in another business or 61 occupation or gainful employment. Any person employed by, 62 owning an interest in or otherwise associated with a broad-63 band deployment project, project sponsor or project participant may serve as a council member and shall not be is not 64 disgualified from serving as a council member because of a 65 66 conflict of interest prohibited under section five, article two, chapter six-b of this code and shall not be is not subject to 67 68 prosecution for violation of said section when the violation 69 is created solely as a result of his or her relationship with the 70 broadband deployment project, project sponsor or project 71 participant *Provided*, That so long as the member recuses 72 himself or herself from board participation regarding the 73 conflicting issue in the manner set forth in legislative rules 74 promulgated by the West Virginia Ethics Commission.

75 (g) No member of the council who serves by virtue of his or her office shall receive receives any compensation or reim-76 77 bursement of expenses for serving as a member. The public 78 members and members of any committees or subcommittees 79 are entitled to be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses incurred for each day or portion thereof engaged in 80 the discharge of his or her official duties in a manner 81 82 consistent with the guidelines of the Travel Management 83 Office of the Department of Administration.

§31-15C-14. Expiration of council.

- 1 The council shall continue to exist until December 31,
- 2 2011, 2014, unless sooner terminated, continued or reestab-
- 3 lished pursuant to an act of the Legislature.
