Senate Bill No. 530

(By Senator Unger)

[Introduced February 16, 2011; referred to the Committee on Finance.]

A BILL to amend and reenact §29-22C-27 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to clarifying that a certain portion of revenues of racetracks that have lottery table games be used for public projects in that county or to make payments on lottery revenue bonds; and clarifying that a certain portion of those revenues be used for public projects in a county's municipalities or to make payments on lottery revenue bonds.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §29-22C-27 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 22C. WEST VIRGINIA LOTTERY RACETRACK TABLE GAMES ACT.

§29-22C-27. West Virginia Lottery Racetrack Table Games Fund;

Community-Based Service Fund; State Debt

Reduction Fund: distribution of funds.

- 1 (a) (1) The special fund in the State Treasury known as the
- 2 West Virginia Lottery Racetrack Table Games Fund is
- 3 continued and all tax collected under this article shall be
- 4 deposited with the State Treasurer and placed in the West
- 5 Virginia Lottery Racetrack Table Games Fund. The fund
- 6 shall be an interest-bearing account with all interest or other
- 7 return earned on the money of the fund credited to and
- 8 deposited in the fund.
- 9 (2) Notwithstanding any provision of this article to the
- 10 contrary, all racetrack table games license fees received by
- 11 the commission pursuant to section eight of this article shall
- 12 be deposited into the Community-Based Service Fund which
- 13 is continued in the State Treasury. Moneys of the fund shall
- 14 be expended by the Bureau of Senior Services upon appro-
- 15 priation of the Legislature solely for the purpose of enabling
- 16 the aged and disabled citizens of this state to maintain their
- 17 residency in the community-based setting through the
- 18 provision of home and community-based services.
- 19 (b) From the gross amounts deposited into the Racetrack
- 20 Table Games Fund pursuant to subsection (a) of this section,
- 21 the commission shall:

- 22 (1) Retain an amount for the administrative expenses of the
- 23 commission as determined by the commission in accordance
- 24 with subsection (e) of this section;
- 25 (2) Transfer two and one-half percent of adjusted gross
- 26 receipts from all thoroughbred racetracks with West Virginia
- 27 Lottery table games to the special funds established by each
- 28 thoroughbred racetrack table games licensees for the
- 29 payment of regular racetrack purses, the amount being
- 30 divided on a pro rata basis between the special funds of each
- 31 thoroughbred racetrack table games licensee and transfer
- 32 two and one-half percent of adjusted gross receipts from all
- 33 greyhound racetracks with West Virginia Lottery table
- 34 games to the special funds established by each greyhound
- 35 racetrack table games licensees for the payment of regular
- 36 racetrack purses, the amount being divided equally between
- 37 the special funds of each greyhound racetrack table games
- 38 licensee;
- 39 (3) Transfer two percent of the adjusted gross receipts from
- 40 all licensed racetracks to the West Virginia Thoroughbred
- 41 Development Fund created under section thirteen-b, article
- 42 twenty-three, chapter nineteen of this code and the West

Virginia Greyhound Breeding Development Fund created under section ten, article twenty-three, chapter nineteen of this code. The total amount transferred under this subdivision shall be divided pro rata among the development funds 47 for each racetrack table games licensee based on relative adjusted receipts from each racetrack. The amounts trans-48 49 ferred to these funds may not be used for the benefit of any person or activity other than at or associated with a race-50 track table games licensee; 52 (4) Transfer one percent of the adjusted gross receipts from 53 each licensed racetrack to the county commissions of the counties where racetracks with West Virginia Lottery table 54 55 games are located. County commissions may pledge this money to make payments on lottery revenue bonds issued 57 pursuant to article two-h, chapter thirteen of this code. The one percent transferred under this subdivision shall be 58 divided pro rata among the counties with a racetrack with 59 60 West Virginia Lottery table games based on relative adjusted 61 gross receipts from each county's racetrack: Provided, That the county board of education of a growth county, as that 62 term is defined in section three, article twenty, chapter seven of this code, which has enacted the Local Powers Act, and in

which county a racetrack is located that has participated in 65 the West Virginia Thoroughbred Development Fund since on 66 67 or before January 1, 1991, shall receive the one percent of 68 adjusted gross receipts as provided in this subdivision for the 69 purpose of public projects, as defined in section two, article two-h, chapter thirteen of this code or to make payments on 70 lottery revenue bonds issued to finance public projects; 72 (5) Transfer two percent of the adjusted gross receipts from each licensed racetrack to the governing bodies of munici-74 palities within counties where racetracks with West Virginia Lottery table games are located. Municipalities may pledge 75 the money to make payments on lottery revenue bonds issued 76 pursuant to article two-h, chapter thirteen of this code. This 77 78 money shall be allocated as follows: 79 (A) One half of the amounts transferred under this subdivision shall be allocated to the municipalities within each county having a racetrack table games licensee, based on relative adjusted gross receipts from West Virginia Lottery 82 table games from those racetracks and the total amount 83 84 allocated to the municipalities within a county shall be 85 divided pro rata among the municipalities based on each

municipality's population determined at the most recent

United States decennial census of population: Provided, That: (i) For each allocation, when a municipality is physi-88 89 cally located in two or more counties, only that portion of its 90 population residing in the county where the authorized table 91 games are located shall be considered; (ii) a single munici-92 pality in a county where West Virginia Lottery racetrack table games are played may not receive a total share under 93 this paragraph that is in excess of seventy-five percent of the 94 95 total distribution under this paragraph for the county in 96 which the municipality is located; and (iii) a municipality receiving moneys under this paragraph may not receive an 97 amount which is less than that received by a municipality 98 99 under provisions of subdivision (4), subsection (d) of this 100 section; and 101 (B) One half of the amounts transferred under this subdivision shall be allocated pro rata to the municipalities within all the counties, having a racetrack table games licensee based on each municipality's population determined at the most recent United States decennial census of population: 105 106 Provided, That: (i) A municipality which received funds 107 above its pro rata share pursuant to subpart (iii), paragraph (A) of this subdivision may not receive an allocation under 108

this paragraph; (ii) for each allocation, when a municipality 109 is physically located in two or more counties, only that 110 111 portion of its population residing in the county where the 112 authorized table games are located shall be considered; and 113 (iii) a single municipality in a county where West Virginia Lottery racetrack games are played may not receive a total share under this paragraph that is in excess of twenty-five percent of the total transfers under this paragraph: *Provided*, 117 however, That the county board of education of a growth county, as that term is defined in section three, article twenty, chapter seven of this code, which has enacted the Local Powers Act, and in which county a racetrack is located 120 that has participated in the West Virginia Thoroughbred 121122Development Fund since on or before January 1, 1991, shall receive the two percent of adjusted gross receipts as provided in this subdivision for the purpose of public projects, as defined in section two, article two-h, chapter thirteen of this code, or to make payments on lottery revenue bonds issued 126to finance the public projects; 127128 (6) Transfer one half of one percent of the adjusted gross receipts to the governing bodies of municipalities in which 130 a racetrack table games licensee is located. The municipali131 ties shall each receive an equal share of the total amount allocated under this subdivision: *Provided*, That distribution 133 under this subdivision may not be made to any municipality which did not have a licensed racetrack within its municipal 135 boundaries as they existed on January 1, 2007: Provided, however, That if no racetrack table games licensee is located 136137within a municipality, a transfer may not be made under this 138 subdivision. The municipality may pledge this money to make payments on lottery revenue bonds issued pursuant to article two-h, chapter thirteen of this code; and 141 (7) Distribute the remaining amounts, hereinafter referred 142 to as the net amounts in the Racetrack Table Games Funds. in accordance with the provisions of subsection (d) of this 143144 section. 145 (c) Beginning with the fiscal year following the licensing of every licensed racetrack to offer West Virginia Lottery racetrack table games under this article, subsection (b) of this section shall be superseded and replaced by this subsection for distribution of the balances in the fund established by subsection (a) of this section. From the gross amounts 150deposited into the fund, the commission shall:

(1) Retain an amount for the administrative expenses of the

(2) Transfer two and one-half percent of adjusted gross

240 county where the authorized table games are located shall be considered; and (iii) a single municipality in a county where 242 West Virginia Lottery racetrack games are played may not receive a total share under this paragraph that is in excess of twenty-five percent of the total transfers under this para-245 graph. 246 (C) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraphs (A) and (B) of this subdivision, when a racetrack is located in a 247 248 growth county, as that term is defined in section three, 249 article twenty, chapter seven of this code, which has enacted 250the Local Powers Act, and in which county a racetrack is located that has participated in the West Virginia Thorough-252 bred Development Fund since on or before January 1, 1991. the county board of education shall receive two thirds of the share of adjusted gross receipts from West Virginia Lottery 255 table games from the racetrack in the county as provided in this subdivision and the municipalities within the county 257 shall share the remaining one third of the total amount allocated as provided in this paragraph. The municipal one-258 259third share shall be divided pro rata among the municipalities based on each municipality's population determined at 260261 the most recent United States decennial census of popula-

All money transferred under this paragraph shall be 263used by the county board of education and by the municipal-264ities for the purpose of capital improvements public projects 265 as defined in section two, article two-h, chapter thirteen of this code or to make payments on lottery revenue bonds issued pursuant to article two-h, chapter of this code to 267 268 finance public projects; 269 (6) Transfer one half of one percent of the adjusted gross 270receipts to the governing bodies of municipalities in which 271 a racetrack table games licensee is located. 323 (e) All expenses of the commission incurred in the adminis-324 tration and enforcement of this article shall be paid from the 325 Racetrack Table Games Fund, including reimbursement of 326 state law-enforcement agencies for services performed at the 327 request of the commission pursuant to this article. The 328 commission's expenses associated with a particular racetrack 329 with authorized table games under this article may not 330 exceed three percent of the total annual adjusted gross receipts received from that licensee's operation of table 332 games under this article, including, but not limited to, all license fees or other amounts attributable to the licensee's 334 operation of table games under this article, except as provided in subdivision (2), subsection (a) of this section. 336 However, for the fiscal year following the licensing of every 337 licensed racetrack to offer West Virginia lottery racetrack table games under this article and for the fiscal year thereaf-338 ter, the commission's expenses associated with a particular 339 340 racetrack with authorized table games under this article may 341 not exceed four percent of the total annual adjusted gross 342 receipts received from that licensee's operation of table games under this article, including, but not limited to, all license fees or other amounts attributable to the licensee's operation of table games under this article, except as provided in subdivision (2), subsection (a) of this section. These expenses shall either be allocated to the racetrack 348 with West Virginia Lottery table games for which the 349 expense is incurred, if practicable, or be treated as general

expenses related to all racetrack table games facilities and be allocated pro rata among the racetrack table games facilities based on the ratio that annual adjusted gross receipts from operation of table games at each racetrack with West Virginia Lottery table games bears to total annual adjusted gross receipts from operation of table games at all racetracks with West Virginia Lottery table games during the fiscal year of the state. From this allowance, the commission shall transfer at least \$100,000 but not more than \$500,000 into the Compulsive Gambling Treatment Fund created in section nineteen, article twenty-two-a of this chapter.

(NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to clarify that a certain portion of revenues of racetracks that have lottery table games be used for public projects in that county or make payments on lottery revenue bonds. The bill also clarifies that a certain portion of those revenues be used for public projects in a county's municipalities or make payments on lottery revenue bonds.
